Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of

Alaska respectfully represents;

WHEREAS, Alaska has potential opportunities for great

10

future industrial development; and

WHEREAS, many and suitable sites needed for these indus-

12

trial plants, mills and related use, etc., are owned by the

13

United States Government; and

WHEREAS, under present law the General Land Office does not

15

have authority to make over 160 acres available for patent; and

16

WHEREAS, some of these sites needed are in excess of 160

17

acres;

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the

19

Territory of Alaska, respectfully prays that Congress immedia-

20

tely authorize sale by the General Land Office, of sites in

21

excess of 160 acres needed for industrial plants, mills and

22

related uses. [The patent should provide that the land would

23

revert to its former status unless used for the purpose intend-

24

ed within a reasonable period of time.]
