HOUSE BILL NO. ~~10~~ *B*

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA
TWENTY-SECOND LEGISLATURE, FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION
A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act to authorize departments and other agencies of the Territory to enter into agreements or contracts with each other for the purpose of furnishing necessary and authorized special or technical services, including services of employees, materials, and equipment."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Section 1. Any Territorial agency or department may enter into and perform a written agreement or contract with other agencies of the Territory for furnishing necessary and authorized special or technical services, including the services of employees, the services of materials, or the services of equipment. The actual cost of rendering the services, or the nearest estimate of the cost that is practicable, shall be reimbursed.

Sec. 2. Before any services may be rendered or received a written agreement or contract shall be entered into, specifying the kinds and amounts of services to be rendered, the bases for calculating reimbursable costs, and the maximum amount of the costs during the time period covered by the agreement. To be valid, the written agreement or contract must be in a form approved by the Attorney General and have the advance approval of the administrators of the Territorial agencies which are parties thereto and of the Director of Finance. Where the amount

1 involved is less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), no written agree-
2 ment or contract or advance approval by the Director of Finance
3 is required.

4 Sec. 3. No agreement or contract may be entered into or
5 performed which will require or permit an agency of the Territory
6 to exceed its statutory duties and responsibilities, or the limi-
7 tations of its appropriated funds. In reviewing proposed agree-
8 ments or contracts the Director of Finance shall consider the
9 following factors, which shall not be considered to be exclusive:

10 (a) Whether the services specified are necessary and essential
11 for activities and work that are properly within the statutory
12 functions and programs of the affected agencies of the Terri-
13 torial Government; (b) Whether the proposed arrangements serve
14 the interests of efficient and economical administration of the
15 Territorial Government; and (c) Whether the specified bases
16 for reimbursing the actual costs are fair, equitable, and
17 realistic and in conformity with the limitations of funds pre-
18 scribed in the current appropriations act or other applicable
19 statutes.

20 Sec. 4. Payments for such services by a receiving agency
21 shall be made from the appropriation items or accounts of the
22 receiving agency from which like expenditures would normally be
23 made, based upon vouchers drawn for this purpose by the receiv-
24 ing agency payable to the furnishing agency. Payments received
25 by the agency performing the services shall be credited to that
26 agency's current appropriation items or accounts from which the
27 expenditures of that character were originally made.

28 Sec. 5. Nothing in this Act shall authorize any agency to
29 construct any building or structure for any other agency, unless

1 otherwise specifically authorized by existing law, except that
2 the Department of Education and the Department of Health may
3 enter into agreements or contracts under the terms of this Act
4 for acquisition of sites, construction, reconstruction, main-
5 tenance, repair, operation, or alteration of joint school and
6 community health center facilities; and that the Department of
7 Aviation and the Highway Engineer may enter into agreements
8 under this Act for acquisition of rights of way, construction,
9 reconstruction, maintenance, repair or alteration of ~~access~~
10 roads serving public airports.
