6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Alaska Motor Ve-  
7 hicle Act; amending Sections 1 and 3 (1)  
8 of Chapter 124, Session Laws of Alaska 1951,  
9 as amended; and declaring an emergency."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

11 Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter 124, Session Laws of Alaska  
12 1951 as amended by Sections 1 and 2, Chapter 59, Session Laws of  
13 Alaska, 1953, is amended by adding subsection (22) to read as  
14 follows:

15 (22) "Special mobile equipment" shall be taken to mean  
16 and include every vehicle not designed or used primarily  
17 for the transportation of persons or property and incident-  
18 ally operated or moved over a highway, including farm  
19 tractors, road construction or maintenance machinery, ditch-  
20 digging apparatus, well-boring apparatus, and concrete  
21 mixers. The foregoing enumeration shall be deemed partial  
22 and shall not operate to exclude other such vehicles which  
23 are within the general terms of this section.

24 Sec. 2. Section 3 (1) of Chapter 124, Session Laws of Alaska,  
25 1951, is amended to read as follows:

26 (1) VEHICLES SUBJECT TO REGISTRATION -- EXCEPTION.

27 Every motor vehicle, trailer and semi-trailer when driven or  
28 moved upon a highway shall be subject to the registration  
29 provisions of this Act except:

(a) Any such vehicle which is driven or moved upon a highway only for the purpose of crossing such highway from one property to another.

(b) Any implement of husbandry which is only incidentally operated or moved upon a highway.

(c) Any special mobile equipment.

Sec. 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
