5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act to provide for a presidential
7 preferential election in years that
8 candidates for president of the United
9 States are to be nominated."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

11 Section 1. In years when candidates for the office of
12 president of the United States are to be nominated, every
13 qualified voter of a political party as provided in Chapter 23,
14 SIA 1953, shall have the opportunity to vote for his or her
15 preference, for one person to be the candidate for nomination by
16 his or her political party for the office of president of the
17 United States, either by writing the name of such person in blank
18 space to be left on the ballot prescribed in this Act for that
19 purpose or by marking with a cross before the printed name of the
20 person of his or her choice.

21 Section 2. The name of any candidate for a party nomination
22 for president of the United States shall be printed on the ballot
23 prescribed in this Act upon filing a declaration of candidacy
24 and payment of a filing fee in the manner prescribed in Chapter
25 23, SIA 1953, or upon the petition of two-hundred of his supporters
26 who are qualified voters in the Territory of Alaska of the
27 political party to which the said candidate belongs. Such
28 petition shall serve in lieu of a declaration of candidacy and
29 shall be filed as above described with the filing fee so prescribed.

Section 5. The names of candidates for party nomination for president of the United States shall be printed on the official ballots for the election of national committeeman and national committeewoman of their respective political parties and the procedures provided in Chapter 23, SLA 1953 shall be adhered to as to voting, marking, counting, and canvassing.
