5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act pertaining to the display of the
7 Flag of the United States and the Flag of
8 the Territory of Alaska; amending Section
9 1-1-3, ACLA, 1949."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

11 Section 1. Section 1-1-3 ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to
12 read as follows:

13 Section 1-1-3. Official flag: Adoption: Manner of
14 Displaying. The winning design of the Flag Contest held
15 in 1927 by the American Legion, Department of Alaska, in
16 the public, private and Native schools of the Territory, be
17 and the same is hereby adopted as the official flag of
18 Alaska.

19 The official flag of Alaska shall be displayed with the
20 flag of the United States only from sunrise to sunset, or
21 between such hours as may be designated by proper authority;
22 provided, however, that said flags may be displayed after
23 sunset upon special occasions when it is desired to produce
24 a patriotic effect.

25 The flag of the United States and the flag of the Terri-
26 tory of Alaska shall be displayed in public on the following
27 days: the first day of January, commonly called New Year's
28 Day; the twentieth day of January, 1957, and every four years

On page 1, line 25, strike all matter commencing on line 25 to and including line 21 on page 2

1 thereafter, commonly called Inauguration Day; the twelfth
2 day of February, commonly called Lincoln's Birthday; the
3 twenty-second day of February, commonly called Washington's
4 Birthday; the thirtieth day of March, commonly called
5 Seward's Day; the sixth day of April, commonly called Army
6 Day; Easter Sunday (variable); the second Sunday in May,
7 commonly called Mother's Day; the thirtieth day of May,
8 commonly called Memorial Day (half-staff until noon); the
9 fourteenth of June, commonly called Flag Day; the fourth
10 day of July, commonly called Independence Day; the first
11 Monday in September, commonly called Labor Day; the seven-
12 teenth day of September, commonly called Constitution Day;
13 the twelfth day of October, commonly called Columbus Day;
14 the eighteenth day of October, commonly called Alaska Day;
15 the twenty-seventh day of October, commonly called Navy Day;
16 the eleventh day of November, commonly called Veteran's Day;
17 the fourth Thursday of November, commonly called Thanksgiv-
18 ing Day; the twenty-fifth day of December, commonly called
19 Christmas Day; and any day designated by public proclamation
20 by the President of the United States or the Governor of the
21 Territory of Alaska, as a legal holiday.

22 The flag of the United States and the flag of the
23 Territory of Alaska shall be displayed daily, weather per-
24 mitting, on or near the main administration building of
25 every institution under the authority or control of the
26 Government for the Territory of Alaska.

27 The flag of the United States shall be displayed in or
28 near every polling place on properly designated election
29 days.

On page 2, line 23, change "shall" to "should"
" line 27, change "shall" to "should"

1 The flag of the United States, of appropriate size,
2 shall be displayed in or about each assembly hall and class-
3 room in each public school building and it shall be the duty
4 and responsibility of the Department of Education and the
5 local school boards to insure compliance with those provi-
6 sions relative to the display of flags in and about the
7 schools.

On page 3, line 1, strike all matter on page 3 and insert in lieu thereof the following: "The flag should be displayed during school days ~~xx~~ in or near every schoolhouse."
