TWENTY-SECOND SESSION

TO THE HONORABLE DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES; THE HONORABLE DOUGLAS MCKAY, SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR; THE HONORABLE JAMES MURRAY, CHAIRMAN OF INTERIOR AND INSULAR AFFAIRS COMMITTEE OF THE UNITED STATES SENATE; THE HONORABLE CLAIRE ENGLE, CHAIRMAN OF THE INTERIOR AND INSULAR AFFAIRS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES; THE HONORABLE E. L. BARTLETT, DELEGATE TO CONGRESS FROM ALASKA; AND TO THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS:

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Alaska, in Twenty-second Session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, the original intent of the Congress of the United States in the matter of the Eklutna Project was to furnish low cost power to the people of the railbelt area of Alaska, to stabilize electric power of the area, and to strengthen the military defense of the area, and

WHEREAS, the present high cost of power being supplied by the Eklutna Project in no way carries out the original intent of Congress in the matter of the Eklutna Project,

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist respectfully requests that the Congress of the United States take appropriate action to provide for the sale of the Eklutna Project to the people of Alaska.
