HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 11

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA

TWENTY-SECOND SESSION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF

THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, The Employment Security Commission fund is critically low, and

WHEREAS, unemployment benefits may be curtailed to the detriment of the recipients of unemployment compensation, who are unemployed through no fault of their own, at a time when they need compensation most; and

WHEREAS, the expenditures of unemployment compensation benefits by the recipients bolsters the economy and stability of many businesses and in effect insures the continuance of many such businesses; and

WHEREAS, Congress has made provision to loan money without interest to such Employment Security Commission Funds that have become inadequate to meet local, State and Territorial needs; and

WHEREAS, such States and Territories have as long as four years to repay such interest-free loans to the Federal Government;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of the Territory of Alaska, in Twenty-Second Session assembled at Juneau, Alaska, that said House requests Honorable E. Frank Heintzleman, Governor of Alaska, to make immediate application for a sufficient loan to maintain the solvency of the Alaska Employment Security Program at its present level.
