HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 13

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA

TWENTY-SECOND SESSION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, dog racing has become one of the important sports of the young men of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, racing events have been held at Kotzebue, Anchorage, and Fairbanks, and in such races many boys of native extraction have achieved outstanding successes as exemplified by the signal victories by "Holy" Smoke of Stevens Village, Raymond Paul of Galena, Alaska, and of Wilbur Sampson, ^{and} Albert Wells of Noorvik and Joe Harris of Kotzebue; and

WHEREAS, the training, endurance, skill and fine sportsmanship shown by these men have aroused the admiration of the people of Alaska,

NOW, THEREFORE, the House of Representatives in Twenty-second Session of the Alaska Legislature do hereby pay tribute to Wilbur Sampson, winner of the 1955 North American Classic run at Fairbanks, and to Albert Wells, who placed second in said race, and to Joe Harris, who was third in said race, and commend them upon their outstanding achievements and upon their endurance, training, and good sportsmanship ^{as} shown in said event.
