TWENTY-SECOND SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act to amend the criminal code relating to confiscation and disposal of weapons used in the commission of a crime; amending Sec. 65-2-15 ACLA 1949."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Section 1. Section 65-2-15, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated, 1949, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 65-2-15. Conviction as working forfeiture of property: Lien for fine and costs. That no conviction of any person for crime works any forfeiture of any property, except in cases where the same is expressly provided by law; but in all cases of the commission or attempt to commit a felony the United States has a lien, from the time of such commission or attempt, upon all the property of the defendant for the purpose of satisfying any judgment which may be given against him for any fine on account thereof, and for the costs and disbursements in the proceedings against him for such crime; and except that any court in Alaska including, but not limited to, a municipal magistrate's court, shall have the power to confiscate any weapon (tool, or instrument) used in the commission of a crime against the laws of Alaska or ordinances of a municipality thereof and to provide for the sale, destruction, or other disposal of said weapon, tool, or instrument.
