6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to penalties for violation
7 of municipal ordinances; amending Subsec-
8 tion Twelfth of Section 16-1-35 ACLA 1949
9 as amended," *by Chapter 44 SLA 1953*

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

11 Section 1. Subsection Twelfth of Section 16-1-35, Alaska
12 Compiled Laws Annotated, 1949, as amended, *by Chapter 44 SLA 1953*
13 as to read as follows:

14 Twelfth. PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF ORDINANCES. To
15 prescribe the punishment for the violation of any municipal
16 ordinance, but such punishment shall not exceed in any case
17 a fine of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or imprisonment
18 in a municipal jail of thirty days, or both, in the dis-
19 cretion of the court, together with the costs of prosecu-
20 tion, ~~Provided~~, that a judgment that the defendant pay a
21 fine may also direct that he be imprisoned in the municipal
22 jail until the fine be satisfied, specifying the extent of
23 the imprisonment, which cannot exceed one day for every
24 five dollars of the fine; and in case the entry of judgment
25 should omit to direct the imprisonment and the extent
26 thereof, the judgment to pay the fine shall operate to
27 authorize and require the imprisonment of the defendant
28 until the fine is satisfied at the rate above mentioned:
29 and provided further, that the council shall have the power

to prescribe by ordinance, for the suspension of Territorial
or municipal motor vehicle operators licenses or permits for
violations [VIOLATING] of municipal ordinances relating to
the use and operation of motor vehicles; except that no
ordinance shall be required in cases where such suspension
is made mandatory by general law. All fines and costs
imposed and collected for violation of municipal ordinances
shall belong to the municipality and be paid over to its
Treasury.
