7 A BILL

8 For an Act entitled: "An act to prohibit employment by the  
9 Territory and ~~its subdivisions~~ of persons  
10 not citizens, with certain exceptions; and  
11 amending Section 11-1-4 ACLA 1949, as  
12 amended by Chapter 82, Session Laws of  
13 Alaska 1951."

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

15 Section 1. Section 11-1-4 ACLA 1949, as amended by Chapter  
16 82, Session Laws of Alaska 1951, is amended to read as follows:

17 ~~Section~~ 11-1-4. EMPLOYMENT OF PERSONS NOT CITIZENS PROHIBITED.

18 It shall be unlawful for the Territory of Alaska (, OR ANY  
19 MUNICIPALITY IN THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA). ~~or any municipal~~  
20 ~~or other political subdivision thereof~~ to employ at any  
21 rate of compensation as officer, agent, or servant, any  
22 person not a citizen of the United States, (EXCEPT THAT THE  
23 PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT SHALL NOT APPLY TO DOCTORS, DENTISTS,  
24 PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES, AND TECHNICIANS EMPLOYED BY THE  
25 ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, PROVIDED HOWEVER, THAT SUCH  
26 PERSONS SHALL HAVE RECEIVED THEIR FIRST PAPERS, AND SHALL  
27 ACTIVELY PURSUE SUCH APPLICATION FOR CITIZENSHIP, AND  
28 SHALL HAVE, BEFORE EMPLOYMENT, TAKEN AND SUBMITTED TO THE  
29 OATH PROVIDED FOR IN CHAPTER 113 S. L. A. 1949 KNOWN AS  
30 THE NON-COMMUNIST OATH.) with the following exceptions:

31 a. Doctors, dentists, public health nurses, and

b. Teachers employed for not more than one year under  
an exchange program between schools in the Territory of  
Alaska and those of other states, Territories, or nations,  
provided that such teachers take and subscribe to the oath  
required of Territorial employees by Chapter 113, Session  
Laws of Alaska 1949.
