A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act to amend Section 40-3-6 (1), ACLA
7 1949, to permit the filling of oral pres-
8 criptions for certain drugs."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

10 Section 1. Subsection (1) of Section 40-3-6 ACLA 1949, is
11 hereby amended to read as follows:

12 Sec. 40-3-6. SALES BY APOTHECARIES.

13 (1) (a) (Sale on written prescription.) An
14 apothecary, in good faith, may sell and dispense narcotic
15 drugs to any person upon a written prescription of a physi-
16 cian, dentist, or veterinarian, dated and signed by the
17 person prescribing on the day when issued and bearing the
18 full name and address of the patient for whom, or of the
19 owner of the animal for which, the drug is dispensed, and
20 the full name, address, and registry number under the
21 Federal Narcotic Laws of the person prescribing, if he is
22 required by those laws to be so registered. If the pre-
23 scription be for an animal, it shall state the species of
24 animal for which the drug is prescribed. The person filling
25 the prescription shall write the date of filling and his
26 own signature on the face of the prescription. The pre-
27 scription shall be retained on file by the proprietor of
28 the pharmacy in which it is filled for a period of two
29 years, so as to be readily accessible for inspection by any

1 public officer or employee engaged in the enforcement of
2 this Act. The prescription shall not be refilled.

3 N (b) (Sale on oral prescription.) An apothecary, in
4 good faith, may sell and dispense, on oral prescription by
5 E any physician, dentist or veterinarian, such narcotic
6 drugs as the Secretary of the Treasury of the United
7 W States shall find and by way of regulation designate to
8 possess relatively little or no addiction liability. Such
9 oral prescription shall promptly be reduced to writing,
10 and the writing filed and preserved by the apothecary for
11 a period of two years from the date on which such prescrip-
12 tion is filled so as to be readily accessible for inspec-
13 tion by any public officer or employee engaged in the
14 enforcement of this Act. In issuing an oral prescription,
15 the prescriber shall furnish the dealer with the same
16 information as is required by law or regulation in case
17 N of a written prescription for narcotic drugs or compounds
18 A of a narcotic drug except for the written signature of
19 the prescriber, and the dealer who fills such prescription
20 shall be required to inscribe such information on the
21 F written record of the prescription made, filed and pre-
22 F served by him, and shall inscribe on the label of the
23 container of the narcotic drug or compound of a narcotic
24 E drug the same information as is required in filling a
25 written prescription. An oral prescription shall not be
26 refilled.
