A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act pertaining to the employment of
7 assistant or associate counsel to the
8 Attorney General of the Territory of Alaska;
9 amending Section 9-1-15, ACLA 1949, as
10 amended by Chapter 3, SLA 1951."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

12 Section 1. That Sec. 9-1-15, ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch.
13 3, SLA 1951, is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 Sec. 9-1-15. Assistant Attorneys General; Appointment,
15 Qualifications, Duties and Powers; Salary; Services Avail-
16 able to department heads; Travel. The Attorney General shall
17 have the power, whenever in his judgment the interests of the
18 Territory demand it, to select and appoint one or more at-
19 torneys who shall be residents of the Territory and admitted
20 to practice law therein, to act and serve, either on a full-
21 time or part-time basis, as assistant or associate counsel
22 as the case may be and while so acting and serving they shall
23 be known and recognized as Assistant Attorneys General with
24 such powers, duties, and privileges as may descend to them as
25 such together with any other powers, duties and privileges
26 that may be specially delegated to them by the Attorney Gen-
27 eral § 7 and at such compensation as he deems proper.

28 WHEN APPOINTMENT BE MADE OF ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL ON A
29 SALARY BASIS, SALARY SHALL NOT EXCEED TO ANY ONE PERSON PER

1 ANNUM THE SUM OF NINE THOUSAND DOLLARS. 7 Expense of employ-
2 ment of assistant or associate counsel by the Attorney Gen-
3 eral shall be paid out of the appropriation for his office,
4 provided however, that the Attorney General may, with the
5 approval of the department head concerned, assign an Assis-
6 tant Attorney General to be stationed in the office of ano-
7 ther department on a part-time basis, in which case that
8 portion of his salary for the time so assigned shall be
9 paid out of the appropriation of the department which said
10 Assistant Attorney General is serving on a permanent part-
11 time basis; and provided further, that in all actions
12 wherein moneys are recovered to the benefit of the Terri-
13 tory the same shall be paid into the General Fund unless
14 otherwise provided by law. With the permission of the
15 Attorney General, the services of an Assistant Attorney
16 General for the purpose of investigation and/or enforce-
17 ment in the matter of violation of territorial statutes
18 shall be available to the heads of the departments of the
19 Territorial Government, but this provision shall not limit
20 the Attorney General in his powers to initiate investiga-
21 tions and enforcements of violations, which may come to his
22 attention. [; AND] In carrying out the duties of his
23 office, the Attorney General and his assistants may. [ARE
24 HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO] 7 travel within and without the Terri-
25 tory of Alaska [.] 7 under the laws and regulations govern-
26 ing the official travel and the payment of travel expenses
27 of all Territorial officials and employees.
