Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Legis-
9 lature of the Territory of Alaska, in Twenty-third Regular Session
assembled, respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, the village of Angoon is in dire need of a road
11 through the village; and

12

13 WHEREAS, the present Angoon-Killisnoo road built by the
Civilian Conservation Corp (CCA) terminates at the outskirts of
14 the village of Angoon; and

15

16 WHEREAS, in some years past the village of Angoon was con-
templating moving to Hood Bay and thereby felt no need to maintain
17 said Angoon-Killisnoo road; and

19 WHEREAS, it has been determined that the proposed movement
of the village to Hood Bay is impractical; and

20

21 WHEREAS, for all practical purposes there is no adequate
road into nor any road through the village of Angoon; and

22

23 WHEREAS, it would be for the well-being of the community to
extend the present Angoon-Killisnoo road through the village to
24 the present school area and continue the same to the new proposed
25 school site; and

27 WHEREAS, the building of such a road would materially assist
fire prevention and contribute to the sanitary facilities of the
28 community by furnishing an area for an adjacent sewer line; and

1 WHEREAS, the building of such a road will contribute to the
2 fulfillment of the social and economic needs of the people of the
3 community of Angoon.

4 NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the House of Representa-
5 tives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in Twenty-
6 third Regular Session assembled, respectfully request that
7 appropriate action be taken by the Territorial Highway Engineer
8 and Board of Road Commissioners to construct such a road through
9 the village of Angoon.
