Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Legis-

12

lature of the Territory of Alaska in Twenty-third Regular Session

13

assembled, respectfully submits that:

14

WHEREAS, of all the public land orders issued by the President

15

of the United States, 35 per cent concern lands in Alaska; and

16

WHEREAS, the greater portion of public domain now subject to

17

public land orders in Alaska are located in the vicinity of the

18

City of Anchorage; and

19

WHEREAS, the United States Corp of District Engineers and the

20

Civil Aeronautics Agency are both located in Anchorage, which

21

Federal Agencies handle all the military and air force withdrawals,

22

which activities represent the greater portion of the necessary

23

operations of the Bureau of Land Management; and

24

WHEREAS, a complete Land Department is necessary in the City

25

of Anchorage; and

26

WHEREAS, it has been indicated that under a pending reorgani-

27

zational plan of the Bureau of Land Management, approximately

28

thirty to forty employees will be removed from the City of

29

Anchorage, thereby limiting its operations and making it less

1 efficient;

2 NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the House of Representatives  
3 of the Territory of Alaska, in regular session of the Twenty-third  
4 Legislature assembled, respectfully urges that the pending re-  
5 organizational plan be reconsidered and again reviewed and that  
6 the office of the Bureau of Land Management in Anchorage be allow-  
7 ed to remain at its present operating level with a full complement  
8 of personnel able to satisfactorily serve a complete regional  
9 land office.
