5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act to provide for the editing, printing,
7 and distribution of Cumulative Supplements
8 to the Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated, 1949;
9 authorizing an appropriation therefor; and
10 declaring an emergency."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA,

12 Section 1. The Attorney General of the Territory of Alaska
13 shall cause to be prepared and published, the 1957 Cumulative
14 Supplements to the Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated of 1949, (here-
15 inafter called "the main volume"), which was published in three
16 volumes under the authority of Chapter 28, Session Laws of Alaska,
17 1947, and adopted as the Code of Alaska by Chapter 1, Extraordi-
18 nary Session, Session Laws of Alaska, 1949, and by Chapter 101,
19 Session Laws of Alaska, 1951. Such supplements shall include all
20 Acts of the Legislature of a general and permanent nature now in
21 force which were enacted during the period from the end of the
22 regular session of 1947 to the end of the regular session of 1957.
23 It shall also include Acts of Congress applicable exclusively to
24 Alaska and notes of court decisions for the period from the close
25 of the main volumes to the close of the Supplements. Such other
26 materials shall be included as, in the opinion of the Attorney
27 General, are necessary and desirable to supplement the main
28 volumes.

29 Sec. 2. The Attorney General is authorized to contract with

1 a competent and experienced law publishing company for the editing
2 and printing of the 1957 Supplements authorized by section 1 of
3 this Act. The contract shall be executed in such terms as the
4 Attorney General may consider proper, and it shall not be neces-
5 sary to call for competitive bids.

6 Sec. 3. The format and style of the 1957 Supplements shall
7 be as similar to that of the main volume. It shall
8 be in three volumes which may be either separately bound in hard
9 covers or in the form of pocket parts, in the discretion of the
10 Attorney General.

11 Sec. 4. The Attorney General shall also cause to be pro-
12 pared and published biennial supplements after 1957. The provi-
13 sions of sections 2 and 3 of this Act shall apply to such supple-
14 ments. In his discretion the Attorney General may execute a
15 single contract for not more than three biennial supplementations,
16 including the one for 1957.

17 Sec. 5. Each volume of each supplement shall contain a
18 certification by the Attorney General that it was prepared under
19 his supervision and in compliance with the provisions of this
20 Act. The text of the laws in such supplements shall be entitled
21 to recognition for all purposes as prima facie evidence of the
22 Laws of Alaska of a general and permanent nature in force on the
23 day preceding the commencement of the session of the Legislature
24 following the one for which laws were last included.

25 Sec. 6. Sets of Supplements published under this Act shall
26 be furnished without charge to those officers and agencies who
27 are entitled by law to the main volumes without charge. Sets of
28 the 1957 Supplements shall be sold for \$20.00 per set. Prices of
29 subsequent Supplements shall be fixed by the Attorney General, not

1 exceeding \$5.00 per set.

2 Sec. 7. Funds in the amount of \$25,000.00 to carry out the
3 provisions of this Act may be appropriated in the General
4 Appropriations Bill of the Alaska Legislature.

5 Sec. 8. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this
6 Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of
7 its passage and approval.
