5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act permitting the employment
7 of females in bona fide food establishments
8 serving intoxicating liquor; requiring
9 establishments employing females to obtain
10 a permit; amending Sub-sec. (A) of Sec.
11 35-4-21, ACLA 1949 as amended by Ch. 131,
12 SLA 1957; and setting an effective date."

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

14 Section 1. Subsection (A) of Sec. 35-4-21, ACLA 1949 as
15 amended by Ch. 131, SLA 1957, is hereby amended to read as
16 follows:

17 (A) A Beverage Dispensary License gives to the holder
18 thereof the right to sell for cash or serve on the premises
19 beer, wine and hard liquors for consumption on the premises
20 only. The Beverage Dispensary License Fee shall be Five
21 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in all towns, villages, settle-
22 ments and places not exceeding fifteen hundred persons and
23 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in all towns, villages and
24 incorporated cities having a population in excess of fifteen
25 hundred persons. The population shall be determined at
26 the time of filing application. Each applicant for a
27 beverage dispensary license shall file with the application
28 a bond either in cash or executed by a surety company, to
29 be approved by the State ~~TERRITORIAL~~ Tax Commissioner.

1 The condition of such bond or undertaking shall be, that
2 the applicant or applicants are the sole owners of the
3 business sought to be licensed and that no other persons
4 are financially interested either directly or indirectly
5 therein and that the applicant or applicants will conduct
6 said business in accordance with the existing applicable
7 laws pertaining to intoxicating liquor in Alaska. Such
8 bond shall be in the penal sum of Twenty-five Hundred
9 Dollars (\$2500.00). Upon revocation of license, said
10 bond shall be forfeited and covered into the TERRITORIAL
11 General Fund.

12 All employees serving intoxicating liquor in an
13 establishment operating under IN a Beverage Dispensary
14 license shall be male citizens of the United States, over
15 the age of 21 years and of good moral character. Provided,
16 however, that female citizens over the age of 21 of good
17 moral character regularly employed as waitresses in an
18 establishment operating under a Beverage Dispensary
19 license may serve intoxicating liquor together with food,
20 if such establishment: (1) regularly service meals as
21 a major and substantial part of its business, (2) applies
22 for and receives a permit to employ females from the Board
23 of Liquor Control. The serving of sandwiches, burgers,
24 hot-dogs, snacks or similar food items shall not qualify
25 an establishment to employ females under this proviso.

26 Any such employee of such place violating the provisions
27 of this Act shall be equally guilty with the holder of the
28 license and shall be punished accordingly.

29 Sec. 2. This Act shall become effective immediately upon

1 its passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such
2 approval.
