5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act permitting the employment of females
7 as waitresses in bona fide food establish-
8 ments to serve intoxicating liquor; requiring
9 establishments employing such females as
10 waitresses to obtain a permit; amending
11 Sub-sec. (A) of Sec. 35-4-21, ACLA 1949 as
12 amended by Ch. 131, SLA 1957; and providing
13 for an effective date."

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

15 Section 1. Subsection (A) of Sec. 35-4-21, ACLA 1949 as
16 amended by Ch. 131, SLA 1957, is hereby amended to read as follows:

17 (A) A Beverage Dispensary License gives to the holder
18 thereof the right to sell for cash or serve on the premises
19 beer, wine and hard liquors for consumption on the premises
20 only. The Beverage Dispensary License Fee shall be Five
21 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in all towns, villages, settlements
22 and places not exceeding fifteen hundred persons and One
23 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in all towns, villages and in-
24 corporated cities having a population in excess of fifteen
25 hundred persons. The population shall be determined at the
26 time of filing application. Each applicant for a beverage
27 dispensary license shall file with the application a bond
28 either in cash or executed by a surety company, to be approved
29 by the State /~~TERRITORIAL~~/ Tax Commissioner. The condition of

1 such bond or undertaking shall be, that the applicant or
2 applicants are the sole owners of the business sought to be
3 licensed and that no other persons are financially interested
4 either directly or indirectly therein and that the applicant
5 or applicants will conduct said business in accordance with
6 the existing applicable laws pertaining to intoxicating liquor
7 in Alaska. Such bond shall be in the penal sum of Twenty-five
8 Hundred Dollars (\$2500.00). Upon revocation of license, said
9 bond shall be forfeited and covered into the TERRITORIAL
10 General Fund.

11 All employees serving intoxicating liquor in an establish-
12 ment operating under IN a Beverage Dispensary license shall
13 be male citizens of the United States, over the age of 21
14 years and of good moral character. Provided, however, that
15 female citizens over the age of 21 of good moral character
16 regularly employed as waitresses in an establishment operating
17 under a Beverage Dispensary license may serve intoxicating
18 liquor together with food, if such establishment: (1) regu-
19 larly serves meals as a major and substantial part of its
20 business, (2) applies for and receives a permit to employ
21 females from the Board of Liquor Control. The serving of
22 sandwiches, burgers, hot-dogs, snacks or similar food items
23 shall not qualify an establishment to employ females under
24 this proviso. Any such employee of such place violating the
25 provisions of this Act shall be equally guilty with the holder
26 of the license and shall be punished accordingly.

27 Sec. 2. This Act shall become effective immediately upon its
28 passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.
