5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the powers of the Local
7 Boundary Commission; providing for an
8 effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 Section 1. COMMISSION DEFINED. The Local Boundary Commission
11 created by the State Organization Act of 1959 is the commission
12 referred to in this Act.

13 Sec. 2. POWERS. The commission may consider any proposed
14 local government boundary change and exercise such other powers
15 as may be prescribed by law. It shall present proposed boundary
16 changes to the legislature during the first ten days of any regular
17 session. The boundary change as recommended shall become effective
18 forty-five days after presentation to the legislature or at the
19 end of the legislative session, whichever is earlier, unless dis-
20 approved by a resolution concurred in by a majority of the members
21 of each house of the legislature. Cities shall have such powers
22 regarding boundaries as conferred on them by general law. The
23 commission may recommend to the legislature the procedures where-
24 by a local government boundary may be adjusted by local action.

25 Sec. 3. MEETINGS: QUORUM. The commission shall meet at such
26 times and such places as may be necessary to carry out the purpose
27 of this Act. A majority of the full membership of the commission
28 shall constitute a quorum to transact business; provided, that it
29 shall take an affirmative vote of the majority of the membership

1 to carry all decisions or proposals.

2 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act shall take effect
3 immediately upon its passage and approval or upon its becoming
4 law without such approval.
