For an Act entitled: "An Act to provide for the examining and licensing of operators of motor vehicles and to prohibit the operation of motor vehicles by any person or persons not so licensed upon the public highways of the state; providing for the revocation and suspension of licenses under certain circumstances; providing penalties for violations of the provisions hereof; repealing Sec. 50-3-1, as amended by Ch. 152, SLA 1955, Sec. 50-3-2, Sec. 50-3-3, Sec. 50-3-4, Sec. 50-3-5, and Sec. 50-3-6, ACLA 1949, and Ch. 70, SLA 1953, as amended by Ch. 152, SLA 1957; and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. DEFINITIONS. The following words and phrases

23

when used in this Act, shall for the purpose of this Act, have

24

the meaning respectfully ascribed to them in this section except

25

in those instances where the context clearly indicates a different

26

meaning:

27

(1) "Vehicle". Every device in, upon or by which

28

any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon

29

a public highway, excepting devices moved by human power or

1 dogs or horses or used exclusively upon stationary rails or  
2 tracks.

3 (2) "Motor vehicle". Every vehicle, as herein de-  
4 fined, which is self propelled.

5 (3) "Farm Tractor". Every motor vehicle designed  
6 and used primarily as a farm implement for drawing plows,  
7 moving machines and other implements of husbandry.

8 (4) "Person". Every natural person, firm, co-  
9 partnership, association or corporation.

10 (5) "Owner". A person who holds the legal title  
11 of a vehicle, or in the event a vehicle is the subject of an  
12 agreement for the conditional sale or lease thereof, with  
13 the right of purchase upon performance of the conditions  
14 stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of  
15 possession vested in the conditional vendee or lessee or in  
16 the event a mortgagor of a vehicle is entitled to possession,  
17 then such conditional vendee or lessee or mortgagor shall be  
18 deemed the owner for the purpose of this Act.

19 (6) "Operator". Every person who is in actual  
20 physical control of a motor vehicle upon a highway.

21 (7) "Non-resident". Every person who is not a  
22 resident of this state.

23 (8) "Highway". The entire width between property  
24 lines of every way or place of whatever nature when any part  
25 thereof is open to the public, as a matter of right, for pur-  
26 pose of vehicular traffic.

27 (9) "Department". The Department of State Police  
28 acting directly or through its duly authorized officers and  
29 agents.

1           (10) "Superintendent". The Superintendent of  
2 State Police, acting directly or through his duly authorized  
3 officers, agents and employees, or any examining officer.

4           Sec. 2. OPERATORS MUST BE LICENSED. No person, except  
5 those hereinafter expressly exempted, shall drive any motor  
6 vehicle upon a highway in this state unless such person upon  
7 application has been licensed as an operator by the department  
8 under the provisions of this Act.

9           Sec. 3. WHAT PERSONS ARE EXEMPT FROM LICENSES. The  
10 following persons are exempt from license hereunder:

11           (1) Any member of the Armed Forces of the United  
12 States who has a valid operator's license issued by any other  
13 state or territory and who maintains his permanent residence  
14 in said state or territory.

15           (2) A non-resident who is at least 16 years of age  
16 and who has in his immediate possession a valid operator's  
17 license issued to him in his home state or territory is exempt  
18 from being required to secure an operator's license under the  
19 provisions of this Act for a period of ninety days after entry  
20 into this state. Provided however that any person gainfully  
21 employed in this state, irrespective of the foregoing provi-  
22 sions, must possess State Operator's License to drive on the  
23 public highways.

24           (3) Any person when operating or driving a road  
25 roller, road machinery, or any farm tractor or implement of  
26 husbandry temporarily drawn, moved or propelled on the high-  
27 ways.

28           Sec. 4. WHAT PERSONS SHALL NOT BE LICENSED. The Depart-  
29 ment shall not issue any license or permit hereunder to any

1 person:

2 (1) Who has not made an application under oath in  
3 his own handwriting on the form provided for that purpose;

4 (2) Who has not attained the age of 16 years, except  
5 that the department may issue a special operator's license as  
6 hereinafter provided to any person who is at least 13 years  
7 of age;

8 (3) Whose license has been suspended during the  
9 period of such suspension;

10 (4) Who is a habitual drunkard, or is an habitual  
11 user of narcotic drugs, or is an habitual user of any other  
12 drug to a degree which renders him incapable of safely opera-  
13 ting a motor vehicle. Two convictions of driving under the  
14 influence of intoxicating liquor under this or any other  
15 Alaska Statute relating thereto or under the ordinance of  
16 any municipality which is substantially the same as the state  
17 law shall be prima facie evidence that such person is an  
18 habitual drunkard under this Act.

19 (5) Who has previously been adjudged insane, or  
20 an idiot, imbecile, epileptic or feeble-minded, and who has  
21 not at the time of application for license been restored to  
22 competency by judicial decree, or released from a hospital  
23 for the insane or feeble-minded upon a certificate from  
24 the superintendent of such hospital that such person is  
25 competent, nor unless the department is satisfied of such  
26 person's competency to operate a motor vehicle with safety  
27 to persons and property.

28 (6) Who is subject to heart attacks, fainting or  
29 dizzy spells, epileptic seizures or who does not have the

1 normal use of both hands and feet; provided that in the latter  
2 instance a license or permit may be issued to such a person  
3 if he has no other disqualifications and demonstrates to the  
4 issuing officer that despite his infirmity he is able to  
5 operate a motor vehicle with safety.

6 (7) When it appears by examination or otherwise  
7 that such person is unable to exercise reasonable and ordinary  
8 control of a motor vehicle because of physical or mental dis-  
9 ability.

10 (8) Who is unable to understand traffic signs or  
11 signals in the English language or who does not have a fair  
12 knowledge of traffic laws and regulations.

13 (9) Who has knowingly made a false statement in his  
14 application for license or has committed any fraud in connection  
15 with his application for or in procuring or attempting to  
16 procure a license;

17 (10) Who has not passed the examination administered  
18 by the Department.

19 (11) Against whom there is an unsatisfied judgment  
20 for damages awarded in any action in which the operation of  
21 any motor vehicle was involved.

22 SEC. 5. PROBATE COURT: REPORTS TO DEPARTMENT: FORMS.  
23 It shall be the duty of the probate courts of this state to  
24 report to the department all changes of name authorized by  
25 such courts, and the name, address, age, description, and  
26 operator's license number when available, of every person  
27 adjudged to be insane, feeble-minded, epileptic, or as a  
28 liquor or drug addict. The department shall prescribe and  
29 furnish the forms for making such reports.

1           Sec. 6. INSTRUCTION PERMITS AND TEMPORARY LICENSES. (1) Any  
2 person who is at least 14 years of age may apply to the depart-  
3 ment for an instruction permit. The department shall, after  
4 the applicant has successfully completed all parts of the  
5 examination other than the driving test, issue to the applicant  
6 an instruction permit which shall entitle the applicant  
7 while having such permit in his immediate possession to drive  
8 a motor vehicle upon the public highways for a period of 90  
9 days when accompanied by an adult licensed operator who has  
10 had at least 1 year of driving experience and who is occupying  
11 a seat beside the driver, except in the event the permittee  
12 is operating a motorcycle. Any such instruction permit may  
13 be renewed or a new permit issued for one additional period  
14 of 90 days. The fee for such instruction permit shall be \$1.00.  
15 There shall be no fee for the renewal.

16           (2) The department upon receiving proper application  
17 shall issue a restricted instruction permit effective for a  
18 school year or more restricted period to an applicant who is  
19 enrolled in a high school or college driver education program  
20 which includes practice driving and which is approved by the  
21 department even though the applicant has not reached the legal  
22 age to be eligible for an operator's license. Such instruction  
23 permit shall entitle the permittee when he has such a permit  
24 in his immediate possession to operate upon a designated high-  
25 way or within a designated area, but only when an approved  
26 instructor is occupying a seat beside the permittee. There shall  
27 be no fee for this permit.

28           (3) The department may issue a temporary driver's  
29 permit to an applicant for an operator's license permitting

1 him to operate a motor vehicle while the department is completing  
2 the processing of his application or its investigation and  
3 determination of all facts relative to such applicant's right  
4 to receive an operator's license. Such permit must be  
5 in his immediate possession while operating a motor vehicle,  
6 and it shall be invalid when the applicant's license has been  
7 issued or for good cause has been denied.

8 (4) The department shall issue a Special Operator's  
9 Permit to any person who is at least 13 years of age for the  
10 purpose of operating a motor scooter or motor bicycle upon  
11 the highways. This permit shall be issued upon receiving  
12 proper application and payment of the fee of \$1.00, and will  
13 be valid for a similar period of time as an operator's license.

14 (5) The department may, upon the recommendation of  
15 the Department of Education, issue a temporary driver's permit  
16 to any person who is at least 14 years of age for the purpose  
17 of attending school. Such permit shall carry the restriction  
18 that it shall only be valid when the permittee is operating a  
19 motor vehicle in going to, or coming from, classroom instruction.  
20 The fee for such permit shall be \$1.00, and shall be valid for  
21 not more than one year from the date of issuance or more restric-  
22 ted period.

23 Sec. 7.. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE OR INSTRUCTION PERMIT: FEE:  
24 DISPOSITION OF PROCEEDS. (1) Every application for an instruc-  
25 tion permit or for an operator's license shall be made upon a  
26 form furnished by the department, shall be verified by the  
27 applicant before a person authorized to administer oaths, and  
28 shall be accompanied by the fee therefor, which fee for an  
29 operator's license shall be \$\_\_\_\_\_ . The fee shall be refunded

1 to the applicant whenever the license applied for is denied,  
2 but in no case shall such fee be refunded to an applicant  
3 who fails to complete all examination requirements of the  
4 department within ninety days from date of application for a  
5 license. Every said application shall state the full name,  
6 date of birth, sex, race and residence address of the appli-  
7 cant, and briefly describe the applicant and shall state whether  
8 the applicant has theretofore been licensed as an operator,  
9 and, if so, when and by what Territory, State or Country, and  
10 whether any such license has ever been suspended or revoked,  
11 or whether an application has ever been refused, and if so,  
12 the date of and reason for such suspension, revocation or  
13 refusal.

14 (2) Whenever application is received from a person  
15 previously licensed in another jurisdiction, the department may  
16 request a copy of his operator's record from such other jurisdiction.  
17 When received, the operator's record shall become a part of the  
18 operator's record in this state with the same force and effect  
19 as though entered on the operator's record in this state in  
20 the original instance.

21 (3) All sums of money received and collected under  
22 the provisions of this Act shall be deposited by the department  
23 in the State Treasury to the credit of the General Fund.

24 Sec. 8. APPLICATIONS OF MINORS. The application of any  
25 person under the age of 18 years for an instruction permit or  
26 operator's license shall be signed and verified before a  
27 person authorized to administer oaths, or in the presence  
28 of the Superintendent or his authorized agents, by the father,  
29 mother or guardian.

1           Sec. 9. EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS. (1) The department  
2 may examine every applicant for an operator's license, except  
3 as otherwise provided in this section. Such examination may  
4 include a test of the applicant's eyesight, his ability to  
5 read and understand highway signs regulating, warning and  
6 directing traffic, his knowledge of the traffic laws of the  
7 state, and may include an actual demonstration of ability to  
8 exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of  
9 a motor vehicle. The department may make provision for giving  
10 an examination either in the community wherein the applicant  
11 resides or at a place convenient to the applicant.

12                   (2) Where necessary, the department may authorize  
13 a municipal police officer, or the chief peace officer of any  
14 judicial district, to conduct the examination of the  
15 applicant.

16           Sec. 10. LICENSES ISSUED TO OPERATORS. (1) The depart-  
17 ment shall, upon payment of the required fee, issue to every  
18 applicant qualifying therefor an operator's license, which  
19 license shall bear thereon a distinguishing number assigned  
20 to the licensee, the full name, date of birth, address, and  
21 a brief description of the licensee, and either a facsimile of  
22 the signature of the licensee or a space upon which the  
23 licensee shall write his usual signature with pen and ink  
24 immediately upon receipt of the license. No license shall  
25 be valid until it has been so signed by the licensee.

26                   (2) Upon renewal as applicable to operators'  
27 licenses the department may for reasonable cause as shown  
28 by its records designate the renewal of the license as  
29 provisional, otherwise a license in usual form shall be issued

1 subject to other provisions of this Act.

2 Sec. 11. LICENSE TO BE CARRIED AND EXHIBITED ON DEMAND.

3 Every licensee shall have his operator's license on his person  
4 at all times when operating a motor vehicle and shall display  
5 the same upon the demand of any uniformed peace officer or  
6 duly authorized representative of the department who identifies  
7 himself as such, and in case of accident to any occupant of  
8 any vehicle involved.

9 Sec. 12. RESTRICTED LICENSES. (1) The department upon  
10 issuing an operator's license shall have authority whenever  
11 good cause appears to impose restrictions suitable to the  
12 licensee's driving ability with respect to the type of, or  
13 special equipment control devices required on a motor vehicle  
14 which the licensee may operate or such other restrictions  
15 applicable to the licensee as the department may determine  
16 to be appropriate to assure the safe operation of a motor  
17 vehicle by the licensee.

18 (2) The department may either issue a special  
19 restricted license or may set forth such restrictions upon  
20 the usual license form.

21 (3) Evidence of any violation of the restrictions  
22 of such license shall result in the suspension by the department of  
23 same for a period of not to exceed one year.

24 Sec. 13. DUPLICATE LICENSE. In the event that an  
25 instruction permit or operator's license issued under the  
26 provisions of this Act is lost or destroyed, the person to  
27 whom the same was issued shall upon the payment of a fee  
28 of \$1.00, obtain a duplicate, or substitute thereof, upon  
29 furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that such

1 permit or license has been lost or destroyed.

2       Sec. 14. EXPIRATION OF LICENSE. (1) Every operator's  
3 license shall expire on the licensee's date of birth, two  
4 years from the birthdate preceding application. Every such  
5 license shall be renewable on, or before, its expiration upon  
6 application and payment of the fee of \$2.00. The department  
7 may require an examination of the applicant as upon an  
8 original application.

9       Sec. 15. SCHOOL BUS DRIVER'S PERMIT. The department  
10 shall issue a School Bus Driver's Permit upon submission of  
11 the required application and completion of driving, written  
12 and physical examinations. Such permit shall expire on  
13 September 1 of the year following issuance and may be renewed  
14 by submission to the department of a current physical exam-  
15 ination. There shall be a fee of \$2.00 for the administra-  
16 tion of the examinations. There shall be no fee for renewal.  
17 No person may operate a school bus carrying children who is  
18 not in possession of a valid School Bus Driver's Permit.

19       Sec. 16. NOTICE OF CHANGE OF NAME. Any licensee who shall  
20 by marriage or otherwise change their name shall within 10 days  
21 thereafter notify the department in writing of such former  
22 and new names and of the number of any license then held by  
23 them.

24       Sec. 17. RECORDS TO BE KEPT BY THE DEPARTMENT. (1) The  
25 department shall file every application for a license received  
26 by it and shall maintain suitable indexes containing, in  
27 alphabetical order:

28             (a) All applications denied and on each thereof  
29       note the reasons for denial;

(b) All applications granted; and

(c) The name of every licensee whose license has been suspended by the department and after each such name note the reasons for such action.

(2) The department shall also file accident reports and citations and records of conviction received by it under the laws of this state and in connection therewith maintain convenient records or make suitable notations in order that an individual record of such licensee showing the convictions of such licensee and the traffic accidents in which he has been involved shall be readily ascertainable and available for the consideration of the department upon any application for renewal of license and at other suitable times.

Sec. 18. AUTHORITY OF DEPARTMENT TO CANCEL LICENSE.

(1) The department is hereby authorized to cancel any operator's license upon determining that the licensee was not entitled to the issuance thereof hereunder or that said licensee failed to give the required or correct information in his application or committed any fraud in making such application.

(2) Upon such cancellation, the licensee must surrender the license so cancelled to the department.

Sec. 19. SUSPENDING PRIVILEGES OF NON-RESIDENTS. The privilege of driving a motor vehicle on the highways given to a non-resident hereunder shall be subject to suspension in like manner and for like cause as an Operator's License issued hereunder may be suspended.

Sec. 20. COURTS TO REPORT CONVICTIONS. Every court having jurisdiction over offenses committed under this Act

1 or any other Act of this state or under any ordinance corres-  
2 ponding to a state law, regulating the operation of motor  
3 vehicles on the highways, shall forward to the department  
4 a record of any conviction of any person in said court for  
5 a violation of any act or ordinance for which the operator's  
6 license of such person may by law be revoked or suspended.  
7 A forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to secure a  
8 defendant's appearance in court, which forfeiture has not  
9 been vacated, shall be equivalent to a conviction.

10 Sec. 21. SUSPENDING LICENSE UPON CONVICTION IN ANOTHER  
11 JURISDICTION. The department is authorized to suspend or  
12 revoke the license of any resident of this state or the privi-  
13 lege of a non-resident to drive a motor vehicle in this state  
14 upon receiving notice of the conviction of such person in  
15 another state or territory of an offense therein which, if  
16 committed in this state, would be grounds for the suspension  
17 or revocation of the license of an operator. The department  
18 is further authorized upon receiving a record of the convic-  
19 tion in this state of a non-resident driver of a motor vehicle  
20 of any offense under the motor vehicle laws of this state, to  
21 forward a certified copy of such record to the motor vehicle  
22 administrator or other appropriate officer in the state when-  
23 ever the person so convicted is a resident.

24 Sec. 22. MANDATORY REVOCATION OF LICENSE BY DEPARTMENT.  
25 The department shall forthwith suspend for a period of not  
26 more than one year after the expiration of the sentence, not  
27 including periods of probation, the license of any person upon  
28 receiving a record of the conviction of such person of any of the  
29 following offenses, whether such conviction be had under state

1 law or local ordinance:

2 (1) Manslaughter or negligent homicide resulting  
3 from the operation of a motor vehicle;

4 (2) Driving a motor vehicle while under the influence  
5 of intoxicating liquor or a narcotic drug, or under the influence  
6 of any other drug to a degree which renders him incapable of  
7 safely driving a motor vehicle;

8 (3) Any crime punishable as a felony under the  
9 motor vehicle laws of this state or any other felony in the  
10 commission of which a motor vehicle is used;

11 (4) Operating any motor vehicle involved in an  
12 accident resulting in the death or injury of another person,  
13 upon a charge of failing to stop and disclose his identity  
14 at the scene of the accident;

15 (5) Perjury or the making of a false affidavit or  
16 statement under oath under any licensing law or regulation  
17 relating to the ownership or operation of motor vehicles.

18 (6) Conviction or forfeiture of bail not vacated  
19 upon three charges of reckless driving all within the pre-  
20 ceding twelve months.

21 (7) Taking a motor vehicle without the owner's consent.

22 Sec. 23. AUTHORITY OF DEPARTMENT TO SUSPEND LICENSE.

23 (1) The department is hereby authorized to suspend  
24 the license of any person without preliminary hearing upon a  
25 showing by its records or other sufficient evidence that such  
26 person:

27 (a) Has committed any offense for the conviction  
28 of which mandatory revocation of license is required;

29 (b) Has, by reckless or unlawful operation of a

1 motor vehicle caused or contributed to an accident  
2 resulting in death or injury to another or serious  
3 property damage;

4 (c) Has been convicted with such frequency of  
5 serious offenses against traffic regulations governing  
6 the movement of vehicles as to indicate a disrespect  
7 for traffic laws and a disregard for the safety of other  
8 persons on the highways;

9 (d) Is an habitually reckless or negligent driver  
10 of a motor vehicle or has committed a serious violation  
11 of the motor vehicle laws of this state;

12 (e) Is incompetent to drive a motor vehicle;

13 (f) Has permitted an unlawful or fraudulent use  
14 of such license; or

15 (g) Has committed an offense in another state which  
16 if committed in this state would be grounds for suspension  
17 or revocation.

18 (2) Upon suspending the license of any person as  
19 hereinbefore in this section authorized, the department shall  
20 immediately notify the licensee in writing and upon his request  
21 shall afford him an opportunity for a hearing as early as  
22 practical within not to exceed twenty (20) days after receipt  
23 of such request in the district wherein the licensee resides  
24 unless the department and the licensee agree that such hearing  
25 may be held in some other district. Upon such hearing the  
26 Superintendent of the State Police or his duly authorized  
27 deputy may administer oaths and may issue subpoenas for the  
28 attendance of witnesses and the production of relevant books  
29 and papers and may require a re-examination of the licensee.

1 Upon such hearing the department shall either rescind its order  
2 of suspension or, good cause appearing therefor, may continue,  
3 modify or extend the suspension of such license or revoke  
4 such license.

5 Sec. 24. RIGHT TO FILE PETITION WHERE LICENSE DENIED OR  
6 REVOKED. Any person denied a license or whose license has  
7 been suspended by the department, except where such suspension  
8 is mandatory under the provisions of this Act, shall have the  
9 right to file a petition within thirty days for a hearing in  
10 the matter in the district court, or its successor, in the  
11 district wherein such person resides, and such court is  
12 hereby vested with jurisdiction and it shall be its duty to  
13 set the matter for hearing upon ten days' written notice to  
14 the department, and thereupon to take testimony and to examine  
15 into the facts of the case, and to determine whether the  
16 petitioner is entitled to a license or is subject to suspension  
17 of license under the provisions of this Act.

18 Sec. 25. SUSPENDING THE LICENSES OF JUVENILES. The  
19 privilege given to juveniles to operate a motor vehicle here-  
20 under shall be subject to suspension in like manner and for  
21 like cause as an adult licensed operator.

22 Sec. 26. DEPARTMENT MAY REQUIRE RE-EXAMINATION. (1) The  
23 department, having good cause to believe that a licensed  
24 operator is incompetent or otherwise not qualified to be licensed,  
25 may upon written notice of at least 5 days to the licensee  
26 require him to submit to an examination. Upon the conclusion  
27 of such examination the department shall take action as may  
28 be appropriate and may suspend or cancel the license of such  
29 subject or permit him to retain such license, or may issue

1 a license subject to restrictions as permitted under this Act.  
2 Refusal or neglect of the licensee to submit to such examina-  
3 tion shall be grounds for cancellation or suspension of his  
4 license.

5 (2) The department shall require the re-examination  
6 of any licensed operator who is 70 years of age or older. The  
7 licensee may be re-examined on the occasion of his license  
8 renewal every two years, or as often as shall be believed  
9 necessary by the department.

10 Sec. 27. PERIOD OF SUSPENSION. (1) The department  
11 shall not suspend the operator's license or privilege to  
12 drive a motor vehicle on the public highways for a period of  
13 more than one year, except as otherwise provided by law.

14 (2) Any person whose license or privilege to drive  
15 a motor vehicle on the public highways has been suspended shall  
16 not be entitled to have such license or privilege renewed  
17 or restored unless the suspension was for a cause which has  
18 been removed, except that after the expiration of the period  
19 of suspension, from the date on which the suspended license  
20 was surrendered to and received by the department such person  
21 may make application for a new license as provided, but the  
22 department shall not then issue a new license unless and until  
23 it is satisfied after investigation of the character, habits,  
24 knowledge of the traffic laws and driving ability of such  
25 persons that it will be safe to grant the privilege of driving a  
26 motor vehicle on the public highways.

27 Sec. 28. SURRENDER AND RETURN OF LICENSE. The depart-  
28 ment upon suspending or cancelling a license shall require  
29 that such license shall be surrendered to and be retained by

1 the department.

2 Sec. 29. NO OPERATION UNDER FOREIGN LICENSE DURING  
8 SUSPENSION IN ALASKA. Any resident or non-resident whose  
4 operator's license or right or privilege to operate a motor  
5 vehicle in this state has been suspended or cancelled as  
6 provided by law shall not operate a motor vehicle in this  
7 state under a license, permit or registration certificate  
8 issued by any other jurisdiction or otherwise during such  
9 suspension or after such suspension until a new license is  
10 obtained when and as permitted under this Act.

11 Sec. 30. UNLAWFUL USE OF LICENSE. (1) No person shall  
12 display or cause or permit to be displayed or have in his  
18 possession any cancelled, revoked, suspended, fictitious  
14 or fraudulently altered operator's license.

15 (2) No person shall lend his operator's license  
16 to any other person or knowingly permit the use thereof by  
17 another.

18 (3) No person shall display or represent as one's  
19 own any operator's license not issued to him.

20 (4) No person shall fail or refuse to surrender to  
21 the department upon its lawful demand any operator's license  
22 which has been suspended or cancelled.

23 (5) No person shall knowingly use a false or  
24 fictitious name in any application for an operator's license  
25 or to knowingly make a false statement or knowingly conceal a  
26 material fact or otherwise commit a fraud in any such application.

27 Sec. 31. DRIVING WHILE LICENSE CANCELLED OR SUSPENDED.

28 (1) Any person who drives a motor vehicle on any public  
29 highway in this state at a time when his privilege to do so

1 is cancelled, suspended or revoked shall be guilty of a  
2 misdemeanor.

3 (2) The department upon receiving a record of  
4 the conviction of any person under this section upon a charge  
5 of driving a vehicle while the license of such person was  
6 suspended shall extend the period of such suspension for an  
7 additional like period of time.

8 Sec. 32. PERMITTING UNAUTHORIZED MINOR TO DRIVE. No  
9 person shall cause or knowingly permit his child or ward  
10 under the age of 18 years to drive a motor vehicle upon any  
11 highway or street in this state when such minor is not authori-  
12 zed by law.

13 Sec. 33. PERMITTING UNAUTHORIZED PERSON TO DRIVE. No  
14 person shall authorize or knowingly permit a motor vehicle  
15 owned by him or under his control to be driven upon any high-  
16 way or street in Alaska by any person who is not authorized  
17 hereunder or in violation of the provisions of this Act.
