6 For an Act entitled: "An Act amending the Alaska Aeronautics Act  
7 relating to the operation and use privileges  
8 of airport or air navigation facilities;  
9 providing for an effective date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 Section 1. Paragraph 1, Subsection E, Section 5 of Chapter  
12 123, SLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

13 1. Under State ~~TERRITORIAL~~ Operation: In operating  
14 an airport or air navigation facility owned or controlled by  
15 the State ~~TERRITORY~~, the Commission or its successor may  
16 enter into contracts, leases and other arrangements covering  
17 periods not in excess of fifty-five ~~TEN~~ years with any person  
18 or municipality or the United States, granting the privilege  
19 of using or improving such airport or air navigation facility  
20 or any portion or facility thereof or space therein for com-  
21 mercial or governmental purposes; conferring the privilege of  
22 supplying goods, commodities, services or facilities at such  
23 airport or air navigation facility. In each such case the  
24 Commission or its successor may establish the terms and con-  
25 ditions and fix the charges, rentals, or fees for the privi-  
26 leges or services, which shall be reasonable and uniform for  
27 the same class of privilege or service and shall be establi-  
28 shed with due regard to the property and improvements used  
29 and the expense of operation to the State ~~TERRITORY~~; pro-

vided that in no case shall the public be deprived of its  
rightful, equal and uniform use of the airport, air navigation  
facility, or portion thereof.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its  
passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.
