HOUSE BILL NO. 335

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

FIRST LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act to preserve the continuity of government."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. The legislature finds that the best interest of the state and the welfare of the people are closely related to the continuity of government. The untoward situation which would inevitably follow an accident resulting in the incapacitation or death of several of the state's executive officers and the subsequent disruption of the continuity of government make it incumbent upon the legislature to effect what safeguards it may to prevent such an unfortunate mishap from occurring and thereby preserve the continuity of government.

Sec. 2. Neither the secretary of state nor more than one cabinet officer may travel on the same aircraft as the governor.

Sec. 3. No more than one cabinet officer may travel on the same aircraft as the secretary of state.

Sec. 4. No more than three cabinet officers may travel on the same aircraft.

Sec. 5. Neither the president of the senate nor the speaker of the house may travel on the same aircraft as the governor or the secretary of state.

Sec. 6. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
