6 For an Act entitled: "An Act amending Ch. 173, SLA 1959; pro-
7 viding for appointment of local agents to
8 issue and renew operators' licenses; pro-
9 viding for fees; authorizing an additional
10 fee for reinstatement of revoked driver's
11 privileges; providing for revocation of
12 licenses when the licensee is convicted of
13 driving under influence of liquor or narco-
14 tic drugs under municipal, borough, or
15 State law; empowering the Commissioner of
16 Public Safety to set standards regarding
17 issuance of School Bus Driver's Permits;
18 and providing for an effective date."

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

20 Section 1. Sec. 9 of Ch. 173, SLA 1959 is amended by the
21 addition of a new subsection to read as follows:

22 N (3) The department is authorized to delegate the
23 E function of issuing and renewing operators' licenses to any
24 W qualified local agent, who is not an employee of the State or
25 of a local government unit and a fee of fifty cents (\$.50)
26 for each license so issued may be deducted from the cost of
27 M the license. No full time state or local government employee
28 A shall be eligible for such fee; the department shall not be
29 T liable for defalcation or failure to account for the fees so

1 N collected by any such agent, but shall require a bond in such
2 E sum as shall be found adequate, conditioned upon faithful
3 W accounting of all monies collected. All persons upon appoint-
4 ment as authorized in this section shall have the power to
5 M administer oaths on applications for licenses. Subject to
6 A the withholding of any compensation authorized by this sub-
7 T section, each person handling licenses shall, as soon as
8 T practicable after the last day of each calendar month, trans-
9 E mit the proceeds from such fees, together with an explanatory
10 R report to the department for deposit in the general fund.

11 Sec. 2. Subsec. 2 of Sec. 27, Ch. 173, SLA 1959 is amended
12 by the addition of a new paragraph as follows:

13 The department is authorized to impose a fee to defray
14 the expense occasioned by the reinstatement of the revoked
15 driving privileges of the licensee.

16 Sec. 3. The opening paragraph of Sec. 35, Ch. 173, SLA 1959
17 is amended to read as follows:

18 Sec. 35. FEES. The following fees are hereby estab-
19 lished for the licenses and permits described:

Sec. 4. Subsec. 2, Sec. 22, Ch. 173, SLA 1959 is amended to read as follows:

(2) The second offense of driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a narcotic drug to a degree which renders him incapable of safely driving a motor vehicle, whether either such conviction shall be had under municipal or borough ordinance or State law; [EITHER UNDER THIS ACT OR CHAPTER 107, SLA 1955;]

Sec. 5. Sec. 15, Ch. 173, SLA 1959 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 15. School Bus Driver's Permit. The department shall issue a School Bus Driver's Permit upon submission of the required application and completion of driving, written and physical examinations. Such permit shall expire on September 1 of the year following issuance and may be renewed by submission to the department of a current physical examination. The fee for examination and renewal shall be as prescribed hereafter. No person may operate a school bus carrying children who is not in possession of a valid School Bus Driver's Permit. The Commissioner may establish by regulation medical standards and standards of driving conduct or proficiency governing the issuance or denial of the School Bus Driver's Permit.

Sec. 6. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
