3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 FIRST LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Relating to continued planning for
6 construction of the Bradley Lake
7 hydroelectric project.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE IN FIRST LEGISLATURE, SECOND SESSION
9 ASSEMBLED, THE SENATE CONCURRING:

10 WHEREAS, electric power facilities in the lower Kenai area
11 are presently overloaded and even greater demands for electric
12 power are in sight; and

13 WHEREAS, economic forecasts for the Kenai indicate that it
14 would be eminently suitable for electroprocess industries, pro-
15 vided that sufficient power now potentially available is made
16 actually available; and

17 WHEREAS, private power companies have expressed complete
18 disinterest in constructing hydroelectric projects in this area;
19 and

20 WHEREAS, a preliminary study of the Bradley Lake hydro-
21 electric project indicates that it will have a minimum capacity
22 of some 48,000 kilowatts;

23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives in First
24 Legislature, Second Session assembled, the Senate concurring
25 that the construction of the Bradley Lake hydroelectric project
26 is essential for the economic growth of the lower Kenai and that
27 the Congressional delegation from Alaska should do all in its
28 power to further the planning for the construction of this
29 project; and be it
