Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the State

12

of Alaska in First Legislature, Second Session assembled, respect-

13

fully submits that:

14

WHEREAS, the people along the Arctic coast of Alaska depend

15

to a major degree upon fuel oil for heat during the winter months;

16

and

17

WHEREAS, the population of this area has been growing at a

18

record rate during the past 10 years due to the increase of

19

employment opportunity in the area; and

20

WHEREAS, the new and planned construction of schools, hos-

21

pitals, and other installations will further increase the Barrow

22

population during the years to come; and

23

WHEREAS, the towns and villages along the Arctic coast have

24

been unable to import sufficient fuel oil and other commodities

25

during the past several years to last through the winter; and

26

WHEREAS, the only vessel supplying the civilian portion of

27

the population of the area is the Bureau of Indian Affairs USMS

28

NORTH STAR, which has reached the limit of its fuel oil capacity

29

and cargo space; and

HM #11 as amended

1           WHEREAS, the USMS NORTH STAR serves over 40 Arctic com-  
2 munities not otherwise served by commercial surface transportation  
3 with fuel oil and other commodities;

4           NOW THEREFORE, Your Memorialist urges that the Department of  
5 the Interior make the necessary arrangements to permit the Bureau  
6 of Indian Affairs or other government ships to provide this  
7 necessary expanded fuel and cargo service to communities not  
8 otherwise served by commercial surface transportation.
