7 motor vehicle operators' licenses; amending

10 152, SLA 1957; and providing for an effec-
11 tive date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. Subsection (e) of Sec. 50-1-4, ACLA 1949, as
14 amended by Ch. 152, SLA 1955, and Ch. 152, SLA 1957, is hereby
15 amended to read as follows:

(c) To promulgate rules and regulations governing:

17

(1) the equipment of motor vehicles;

18

(2) the inspection of vehicles;

19

(3) the size, weight and load limits of all vehicles

20

or combinations of vehicles operating upon the public roads

21

and highways or using the bridges and ferries, including

22

power to grant permits to exceed such limits when justi-

23

fiable in unusual cases;

(4) the qualification of applicants for operator's

license;

(5) the collection of a fee of two dollars from each

27

applicant by the Department of Territorial Police, or its

successor to the function of licensing motor vehicle operators,

for the issuance of motor vehicle operators' licenses to

expire on the applicant's second birthday after the date of issue;

(6) the form of application for license and oath thereto and supporting affidavits;

(7) the cancellation, revocation, suspension and surrender of licenses, and prescribing causes therefor; provided that nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the courts of the state from cancelling, revoking, suspending or demanding the surrender of licenses upon grounds provided by law, the said courts having concurrent jurisdiction with the Alaska Highway and Public Works Board, or its successor to the function of regulating the motor vehicles of the state, so to do EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE SPECIFICALLY PROVIDED;

(8) the possession, use and display of licenses.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.
