6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the annual and sick  
7 leave of state officers and employees;  
8 amending subsection (a) of Sec. 11-5-6,  
9 ACLA 1949 as amended by Ch. 182, SLA 1957;  
10 and providing for an effective date."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

12 Section 1. Subsection (a) of Sec. 11-5-6, ACLA 1949 as  
13 amended by Ch. 182, SLA 1957 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 Sec. 11-5-6. LEAVES OF ABSENCE. (a) Annual Leave.

15 State ~~TERRITORIAL~~ officers and employees shall be entitled  
16 to one and one-quarter ( $1\frac{1}{4}$ ) working days annual leave of  
17 absence with pay for each month of service. Such leave may  
18 be taken by an officer or employee at any time business permits,  
19 and, in the case of an employee, upon permission by the head  
20 of the department, office or agency for which such person  
21 works, and if such leave is not used in full during any one  
22 year, it shall accumulate, provided that the total accumulation  
23 shall not exceed sixty working days, provided, further, how-  
24 ever, that any state ~~TERRITORIAL~~ employee earning com-  
25 pensatory leave time as a result of working in excess of  
26 regular hours of employment in the manner set out in  
27 ~~PURSUANT TO~~ Chapter 88, SLA 1955, may accumulate and have  
28 credit for, said earned compensatory leave time in excess of  
29 60 working days. Terminal pay for unused leave, but not

1 including earned compensatory leave, shall be allowed as a  
2 lump-sum upon separation from service. Such lump-sum payment  
3 shall equal the compensation that such officer or employee  
4 would have received had he remained in the service until the  
5 expiration of such annual leave, but such lump-sum payment  
6 shall not include payment for earned compensatory leave which  
7 has not been taken by such officer or employee. If such  
8 officer or employee is reemployed in the state [TERRITORIAL]  
9 service prior to the expiration of the period covered by such  
10 leave payment, he or she shall refund to the next previous  
11 employing agency an amount equal to the compensation covering  
12 the period between the date of reemployment and the expiration  
13 of such leave period. The leave represented by any such refund  
14 shall be recredited to such officer or employee in the em-  
15 ploying agency in an amount equal to the amount represented  
16 by the refund. Any amounts so refunded shall be deposited  
17 in the state treasury [TERRITORIAL TREASURY] to the credit of  
18 the appropriation established for the payment of terminal  
19 leave. The lump-sum payment herein authorized shall not be  
20 regarded as salary or compensation except for purposes of  
21 taxation.

22 Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect July 1, 1959.
