6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to lotteries; amending
7 Sec. 65-13-1, ACLA 1949."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 Section 1. Sec. 65-13-1, ACLA 1949 is amended to read as
10 follows:

11 Sec. 65-13-1. LOTTERIES: PROMOTING OR SETTING UP.

12 That if any person shall promote or set up any lottery for
13 money or other valuable thing, or shall dispose of any pro-
14 perty of value, real or personal, by way or means of lottery,
15 or shall aid or be in any way concerned in setting up, manag-
16 ing, or drawing such lottery, or shall in any house, shop,
17 boat, shed, or building owned or occupied by him or under his
18 control, knowingly permit or suffer the setting up, manage-
19 ment, or drawing of any such lottery, or the sale of any
20 lottery tickets, share of a ticket, or any writing, token,
21 or other device purporting or intended to entitle the holder
22 or bearer thereof, or any other person, to any prize or
23 interest or share thereof, to be drawn in any lottery, such
24 person, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by
25 imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than six months
26 nor more than one year, or by imprisonment in [THE COUNTY]
27 jail not less than three months nor more than one year, or by
28 fine not less than one hundred nor more than one thousand
29 dollars; provided however, that the provisions of Sections

1 through 6 of Ch. 13 of this Title do not apply to bingo games, raffles, lotteries, or similar games conducted and operated by the state or its political subdivisions, or bona fide charitable, religious, fraternal, educational, or non-profit organizations for public, religious, charitable, or educational purposes; nor do they apply to non-profit lotteries in which contestants are to guess the time of the annual spring break-up of any frozen water course or body of water.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.
