For an Act entitled: "An Act to provide for the apportionment and

7

expenditure of federal moneys received as

8

the state's share of the receipts from

9

national forest reserves."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. It is the purpose of this Act to bring Alaskan

12

law into conformity with federal statutes relating to the appor-

13

tionment and expenditure of receipts from the national forest

14

reserves. After the formation of organized boroughs, it is the

15

intention of this Act that some or all of the moneys received from

16

national forest reserves shall be apportioned among the organized

17

boroughs as set forth in this Act.

18

Sec. 2. a. All sums received by the state from the federal

19

government as the state's share of the receipts collected by the

20

federal government for forest reserve rentals, timber sales, and

21

other sources from forest reserves within this state shall be

22

apportioned as follows:

23

(1) Each organized borough shall receive such propor-

24

tional amount of the sum as the area of the forest reserve included

25

within the boundaries of the organized borough bears to the total

26

area of the forest reserve within the state.

27

(2) The remainder of the sum received shall be placed

28

in the general fund.

29

b. The commissioner of revenue shall ascertain from the

1 proper federal officials having records of receipts from forest
2 reserves, the amount of receipts from each forest reserve in this
3 state. A separate account shall be kept of the sum received from
4 each forest reserve so that the commissioner may apportion the
5 proper amount to each organized borough containing a part of a
6 forest reserve.

7 Sec. 3. All moneys received from the federal government as
8 the state's share of the receipts from national forest reserves
9 shall be spent only for roads and schools.

10 Sec. 4. Sec. 47-5-1, ACLA 1949 is repealed.

11 Sec. 5. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1961.
