SENATE BILL NO.207

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA
FIRST LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to competitive bids in state purchasing; repealing and re-enacting Subsec. (1), Sec. 3, Art. IV, Ch. 82, SLA 1955 as amended by Sec. 8, Ch. 186, SLA 1957; and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. Subsec. (1), Sec. 3, Art. IV, Ch. 82, SLA 1955 as amended by Sec. 8, Ch. 186, SLA 1957, is repealed and re-enacted to read as follows:

(1) All contracts for construction and repairs, and all purchases of and contracts for supplies, materials, equipment, and contractual services shall be based on competitive bids, and awards shall be made to the lowest responsible bidder after advertising for bids as herein provided. Bids on other than contractual services shall be awarded to an Alaskan bidder when the amount of the bid is not more than 5% higher than the lowest bid submitted by a non-resident bidder. Bids for contractual services shall be awarded to an Alaskan bidder when the service will be performed exclusively within the state and when the amount of the bid is not more than 5% higher in the case of southeastern Alaska bidders or 15% higher in the case of western Alaska bidders than the lowest bid submitted by a non-resident bidder. Competitive bids need not be required for contractual services where no

competition exists; or sales involving fair trade items; or when, in the judgment of the Purchasing Agent, food, clothing, or medical supplies, or materials for use in laboratory and experimental studies may be purchased otherwise to the best advantage of the state, or where rates are fixed by law or ordinance; or for items traded in on like items; or for professional services.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
