For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the records of the
7 Alaska Constitutional Convention of 1955-
8 1956; authorizing an appropriation; and pro-
9 viding for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. It is the intent of the legislature that the

12

record of the proceedings of the Alaska Constitutional Convention,

13

1955-1956, be completed and preserved in permanent form because of

14

its legal, historical and research value to the state and its

15

citizens.

16

Sec. 2. The secretary of state, acting as the director of

17

archives for the state, is assigned the duty of accomplishing the

18

editing, indexing, duplicating by printing or similar process, and

19

distributing a compilation of the daily journals, transcript of

20

proceedings, committee and delegates proposals, committee reports,

21

and other materials incidental to the work and deliberations of

22

the convention. The secretary of state is authorized to integrate

23

and arrange logically all relevant records and materials of the

24

convention. The record will be certified by the president and

25

secretary of the convention, or in the event of their inability to

26

act for any reason, by the secretary of state.

27

Sec. 3. The form and style of publication of the record of

28

the convention shall be determined by the secretary of state with

29

the advice and assistance of the attorney general, the chief justice

1 of the supreme court or his designee, and the executive director of
2 the legislative council. The legislative council will provide the
3 secretary with such technical assistance and service as may be
4 mutually determined necessary between the secretary of state and
5 the council.

6 Sec. 4. An appropriation to the office of the governor to
7 cover the necessary contractual services and other expenses in-
8 cidental to carrying out the purpose of this Act not exceeding
9 \$15,000 is authorized and may be included in the general appropria-
10 tion bill.

11 Sec. 5. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
12 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
