SENATE BILL NO. 256

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

FIRST LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act to provide for the appointment of
deputies to assist Division of State
Police; and providing for an effective
date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. The Commissioner of the Department of Public
Safety may deputize, as he deems necessary, such persons over the
age of 21 years to aid and assist the Division of State Police
in the enforcement of the criminal statutes effective within the
state. They are authorized and empowered to prevent crime,
pursue and apprehend offenders, obtain legal evidence, institute
criminal proceedings, execute any lawful warrant of arrest and/or
search and seizure, or execute any other criminal process issuing
from any court of the state. They may make arrests without
warrant in the same manner as the members of the Division of State
Police. They shall have such authority and duty within geographi-
cal limits to be determined by the commissioner. They shall serve
at the will of the commissioner. Such persons may carry identi-
fication; they shall carry arms openly or concealed as the
commissioner may require. Each person deputized shall take the
state oath of office before entering upon the performances of
his duties.

Any person deputized may hold other employment, public or
otherwise. They may be compensated in the discretion of the

commissioner.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
