SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7
IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA
FIRST LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA, FIRST LEGISLATURE, FIRST SESSION, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING:

WHEREAS, there is a village located at the confluence of Ship Creek on the mud flats at the head of Cook Inlet which lacks suitable anchorage facilities for sea going vessels, and

WHEREAS, the village was named in the early day BC (before Cooper), when a river boat was considered a ship, and

WHEREAS, the village deserves a name in keeping with its distinguished citizens and progress and not connected with anchors

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this village north of Seldovia, adjacent to Elmendorf Air Force Base, Fort Richardson and a suburb of the City of Palmer be named in honor of one of its distinguished citizens, a prominent attorney, former United States District Judge, a Senator of this First State Legislature, a scholar and a gentleman, and that said village be called COOPERVILLE; and it is

FURTHER RESOLVED that since water may be involved in this resolution, that the same be referred to Senator Bronson, Chairman of the Federal Relations Committee.
