2 SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 11

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 FIRST LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE IN THE FIRST LEGISLATURE, FIRST
6 SESSION ASSEMBLED, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING:

7 WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Alaska, Article XII
8 Sections 6 and 7, provides for the establishment of a Merit
9 System and a Retirement System for employees of the State; and

10 WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 108 and House Bill No. 188 have been
11 introduced by the respective Rules Committees at the request of
12 the Governor to accomplish these two purposes; and

13 WHEREAS, the members of the First Session of the Alaska Legis-
14 lature, being in sympathy with such principles, note that time is
15 very limited for the study of the details of these plans before
16 the probable date of adjournment of this First Session; and

17 WHEREAS, it is further recognized that the adoption of a
18 sound merit and retirement plan is important in retaining present
19 employees, as well as in recruiting of future employees;

20 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in the First Leg-
21 islature, First Session Assembled, the House of Representatives
22 concurring, that favorable consideration will be given to a Merit
23 System and to a Retirement System at the earliest possible time;
24 and be it

25 FURTHER RESOLVED, that studies be conducted on Senate Bill
26 No. 108 and House Bill No. 188 within the executive branch, as the
27 Governor may direct, and by the Legislative Council at the earliest
28 possible date, and that reports and recommendations thereon be
29 ready for final consideration by this Legislature at the next
