IN THE SENATE BY SENATORS MOODY AND RYAN
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 21
IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA
FIRST LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

Relating to the Port of Whittier.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE IN FIRST LEGISLATURE, SECOND SESSION
ASSEMBLED, THE HOUSE CONCURRING:

WHEREAS, there is every indication that the U. S. Army is
going to abandon the Port of Whittier; and

WHEREAS, the state stands in good stead to receive the Port
of Whittier from the federal government without charge; and

WHEREAS, since it is unknown whether acquisition of the Port
of Whittier would be advantageous or disadvantageous, it certainly
behooves the state to investigate the feasibility of acquiring the
Port of Whittier; and

WHEREAS, the federal government may offer the Port of Whittier
to the state at any time and the state should be prepared to
accept or reject the offer;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in First Legislature, Second
Session assembled, the House of Representatives concurring, that
the Governor appoint a committee to investigate the feasibility of
acquiring the Port of Whittier and that the committee inquire into
the necessity of acquiring the Port in order to protect other
ports, into the possibility of the Port's use by private industry
on lease from the state, into the state's acquiring and then
selling the Port for profit, and into the state's acquiring the
Port for its own use.
