5 TO THE HONGRABLE FRED A. SEATON, SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR:

6 Your Memorialist, the Senate of the State of Alaska in First
7 Legislature, First Session assembled respectfully submits that:

8 WHEREAS, there is situate in the State of Alaska, a mountain
9 of memorable beauty which to this day remains unnamed; and

10 WHEREAS, this particular mountain rises to an elevation of
11 4,204 feet and can be described as northeast of the City of Anchor-
12 age, between Peters Creek and Eagle River at 61° 18' latitude,
13 149° 24' longitude and is at the head of an unnamed creek which
14 enters Eagle River at the Highway Bridge, approximately one and
15 one-half miles west of the Seward Meridian; and

16 WHEREAS, certain residents of the area adjacent to and nearby
17 this mountain are most interested that it be appropriately named;
18 and

19 WHEREAS, said residents have, since 1953, been urging that the
20 mountain be properly and officially named as Mount Magnificent;

21 NOW THEREFORE, Your Memorialist respectfully urges that all
22 possible steps be taken and through the Board of Geographic Names
23 of the Department of the Interior to see that the above described
24 mountain be named Mt. Magnificent in accordance with the wishes of
25 the Alaska Legislature as expressed in this Memorial.
