5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the compensation of
7 temporary session employees of the legis-
8 lature; and repealing Ch. 6, SLA 1959."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 Section 1. BASIS OF COMPENSATION. Temporary session em-
11 ployees of the legislature shall be compensated on the basis of
12 actual time spent in accomplishing the necessary work of the
13 session under the direction of and as reported by their immediate
14 supervisors to the fiscal officer.

15 Sec. 2. HOURLY RATE. In recognition of the temporary nature
16 of the work and the absence of certain fringe benefits accruing
17 to permanent employees, the temporary session employees shall be
18 paid at an hourly rate not to exceed 15% more than rates devised
19 for permanent employees of the state doing commensurate work.
20 Compensation on an adjusted hourly basis for actual time at work
21 is intended to give recognition to diligence and ability in per-
22 formance and to avoid the daily or other pay plans which discri-
23 minate against employees whose services are required for more
24 hours and days of work.

25 Sec. 3. WAGE SCHEDULE. A uniform schedule of adjusted
26 hourly wage rates for temporary employees shall be devised by the
27 fiscal officer each year and submitted on or by the first day of
28 each session to the joint committee on permanent help for its
29 review, adjustment and adoption. The fiscal officer will keep

1 the joint committee advised of the impact of the wage schedule
2 on the current appropriation and the budget request for compensa-
3 tion of temporary employees.

4 Sec. 4. REPEAL. Ch. 6, SLA 1959, is repealed.
