HOUSE BILL NO. 413

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

SECOND LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act providing for the appearance of Alaskan Native dancers as representatives of the State of Alaska at the world's trade fair at Seattle, the Century 21 Exposition; and providing an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. The director of the division of tourism and economic development is authorized to select four Native dancing teams; one from King Island, one from the Barrow-Point Hope-Kotzebue area, one from Haines, and one from Hoonah, to represent the state at the world's trade fair at Seattle, the Century 21, Exposition.

Sec. 2. The director shall assist in arranging for each team's transportation from its home town or area to Seattle, Washington and back. He shall arrange for each team's performances and shall manage expenditures and receipts of money in that connection. He shall pay each dancer, for representing the state, a per diem allowance necessary to supplement receipts from performances.

Sec. 3. As a condition of selection as a representative of the state, a dancer must agree with the director

(1) that, while in Seattle, he will not perform as a Native dancer except at performances arranged for by the director; and

1 (2) that he will not use or authorize to be used his  
2 position, status, or reputation as a dancer at the Century 21  
3 Exposition to endorse or promote the sale of goods not made by  
4 him.

5 Sec. 3. A dancer who violates the agreement becomes ineli-  
6 gible to receive any benefit under this Act, and liable to the  
7 state for any benefit already received.

8 Sec. 4. No person may use another's position, status, or  
9 reputation as a dancer at the Century 21 Exposition to endorse  
10 or promote the sale of goods.

11 Sec. 5. A person who violates Sec. 4 of this Act is guilty  
12 of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, is punishable by a fine of  
13 not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than one  
14 year, or by both.

15 Sec. 6. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage  
16 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
