HOUSE BILL NO. 430

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

SECOND LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act permitting the use of reels mounted on seine skiffs for hauling in or letting out purse seine leads; and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. Sec. 1, Ch. 26, SLA 1959, is amended to read:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association to use, employ or operate a drum or reel, around which a purse seine is coiled, rolled or looped for purposes of taking or removing fish from any body of water, located on or over and lands or tidelands owned or hereafter acquired by the State of Alaska, or over which the State of Alaska has or hereafter acquires jurisdiction.

Nothing herein shall prevent the use of power blocks or the use of a reel mounted on a seine skiff to haul in or let out the separate purse seine lead which is temporarily connected to the purse seine proper, as these terms are [THAT TERM IS] generally employed or used in the fishing industry.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
