SENATE BILL NO. 84

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

SECOND LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act designating Washington's Birthday as an official school holiday; and amending Sec. 37-1-7, ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch. 54, SLA 1955."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

Section 1. Sec. 37-1-7, ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch. 54, SLA 1955, is amended to read:

Sec. 37-1-7. SCHOOL HOLIDAYS. No teacher shall be required to teach school on Washington's Birthday, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and the day immediately following Thanksgiving Day, Christmas, New Years, Memorial Day and the Fourth of July, nor shall the monthly salary of any teacher be diminished because of the fact that these holidays fall on a school day. If any one of these holidays shall fall on a Saturday, the Friday immediately preceding shall be considered a school holiday. If any one of these holidays shall fall on a Sunday the Monday immediately following shall be considered a school holiday. The public schools shall be in session on all other legal holidays falling upon school days and shall give appropriate exercises in commemoration of the day; Provided, that the school board may declare a holiday when good reason exists therefor.
