6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to imprisonment on  
7 judgment for payment of fine; raising  
8 the monetary allowance for time served;  
9 and granting additional monetary return  
10 for work during confinement; amending  
11 Sec. 66-16-14 ACLA 1949; and providing  
12 for an effective date."

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

14 Section 1. Sec. 66-16-14, ACLA 1949 is amended to read as  
15 follows:

16 Sec. 66-16-14. IMPRISONMENT ON JUDGMENT FOR PAYMENT  
17 OF FINE. That a judgment that the defendant pay a fine  
18 must also direct that he be imprisoned [IN THE COUNTY JAIL]  
19 until the fine be satisfied, specifying the extent of the  
20 imprisonment, which can not exceed one day for every five  
21 [TWO] dollars of the fine; and in case the entry of judg-  
22 ment should omit to direct the imprisonment and the extent  
23 thereof, the judgment to pay the fine shall operate to  
24 authorize and require the imprisonment of the defendant  
25 until the fine is satisfied at the rate above mentioned.  
26 If the defendant chooses to work during the imprisonment,  
27 he may be granted an additional reduction of five dollars  
28 of fine for each day worked. Prisoners may be employed  
29 only in undertakings that do not put them in competition
