5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the licensing of junk
7 dealers; repealing Secs. 35-2-171, 35-2-172,
8 35-2-173, and 35-2-174, ACLA 1949; and pro-
9 viding for an effective date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 Section 1. LICENSE REQUIRED. No person may engage in
12 business as a junk dealer in the state before obtaining an annual
13 license from the commissioner of revenue in addition to a business
14 license.

15 Sec. 2. LICENSE FEE. The annual license fee for junk
16 dealers shall be \$100.00 if the person is a resident and \$200.00
17 if the person is a nonresident. The license is not transferable.

18 Sec. 3. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE. Application shall be made
19 to the commissioner of revenue and in a manner prescribed by the
20 commissioner.

21 Sec. 4. PENALTIES. Any person, resident or nonresident,
22 engaging in business as a junk dealer in this state who operates
23 without a license prescribed by this Act is guilty of a mis-
24 demeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not
25 more than \$500.00 or by imprisonment for a term not to exceed one
26 year, or by both.

27 Sec. 5. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Act:

28 (1) "person" means any individual, firm, partnership,
29 company, association, or corporation;

1 (2) "junk" includes any used scrap iron, copper, lead,
2 zink, aluminum, tin, or other metals, and any machinery, tools,
3 implements, furniture, rags, rubber, paper, and other personal
4 property;

5 (3) "junk dealer" means any person engaged in the
6 business of buying, selling, and dealing in junk, or maintaining
7 a place where junk is gathered together and stored or kept for
8 shipment, sale, or transfer.

9 Sec. 6. REPEALER. Secs. 35-2-171, 35-2-172, 35-2-173, and
10 35-2-174, ACLA 1949, are repealed.

11 Sec. 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect on the day
12 after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without
13 such approval.
