7 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board; amending

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

12 Section 1. Subsec. (A), Sec. 35-4-1, ACLA 1949, as last
13 amended by Sec. 1, Ch. 183, SLA 1960, is amended to read:

14 Sec. 35-4-1. CREATION OF BOARD AND OFFICE OF DIRECTOR.

15 (A) There is hereby established an Alcoholic Beverage Con-
16 trol Board in the Department of Revenue consisting of four
17 [THREE] members appointed for overlapping three-year terms;
18 and the Board is hereby vested with the duties, powers, and
19 responsibilities involved in the control of alcoholic
20 beverages, including the promulgation of rules and regula-
21 tions and the hearing of appeals from the action of officers
22 and employees charged with enforcing the alcoholic beverage
23 control laws, rules, and regulations. The functions and
24 authority heretofore performed and exercised by the Board of
25 Liquor Control are hereby transferred to the Alcoholic
26 Beverage Control Board. The Board shall be appointed by the
27 Governor, with one member appointed from each of the four
28 major senatorial districts of the state, and confirmed by
29 the Legislature. No member of the Board shall hold any

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other office, either elective or appointive, under the State or Federal Governments. One member of the Board shall be actively engaged in the alcoholic beverage industry. No two members of the Board shall be engaged in the same business, occupation or profession. Two members shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of business. The Board shall meet at least once each year in each of the four judicial districts to study, reconsider and modify existing agency rules and regulations in the light of current local problems.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
