5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to motor vehicles."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 Section 1. Sec. 3(1), Ch. 124, SLA 1951 as last amended by
9 Ch. 73, SLA 1959 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

10 (d) Any motor vehicle or trailer which would otherwise
11 be registered, but which will only be on the public highways
12 for the purpose of moving from one point to another prior to
13 actual sale or use, and for which an in-transit permit has
14 been issued.

15 Sec. 2. Sec. 3(2)(f), Ch. 124, SLA 1951, as added by Ch.
16 120, SLA 1957 is amended to read:

17 (f) An application for the registration of a new vehi-
18 cle purchased from a dealer shall be accompanied by a
19 "Statement of Motor Vehicle Sale" upon a form approved by
20 the Department, which statement shall include the following
21 information: name and address of dealer; name and address
22 of purchaser; make, body style, year, engine number, and
23 model or series number of vehicle. Other information may be
24 required by the Department but information shall not be
25 required which duplicates the information required by the
26 Federal Government. [; WHETHER THE VEHICLE IS NEW OR A
27 DEMONSTRATOR; AN ITEMIZED BREAKDOWN OF THE PRICE CHARGED
28 THE PURCHASER TO CLEARLY REFLECT THE SEPARATE CHARGES FOR
29 TAXES, TRANSPORTATION, ACCESSORIES, LICENSE, TRANSFER, TITLE

1 FEES, AND ALL OTHER CHARGES; THE TOTAL CASH DELIVERED PRICE;
2 A CLEAR AND CONCISE DESCRIPTION OF ALL CREDITS AGAINST THE
3 PURCHASE PRICE BY PAYMENT OR TRADE-IN OR OTHERWISE; IF THE
4 VEHICLE SHALL BE SOLD ON A TIME CONTRACT THE STATEMENT SHALL
5 INCLUDE AN ITEMIZED BREAKDOWN OF ALL FINANCE, INSURANCE AND
6 OTHER CHARGES MADE BY THE DEALER TO ARRIVE AT THE TRUE BAL-
7 ANCE. SUCH] The statement shall be subscribed and sworn to
8 before a notary public by a duly authorized representative of
9 the dealer. A copy of such statement shall be furnished to
10 the purchaser by the dealer prior to the consummation of the
11 sale.

12 Sec. 3. Sec. 3(12), Ch. 124, SLA 1951 is amended to read:

13 (12) EXPIRATION OF REGISTRATION. Every vehicle regis-
14 tration under this act and every registration card and every
15 registration plate issued hereunder shall expire at midnight
16 on the thirty-first day of May [DECEMBER] of each year. The
17 owner of a vehicle registered under this act shall be entitled
18 to operate such vehicle under the registration of such vehi-
19 cle for the preceding year upon displaying the registration
20 plates issued for such year until the thirty-first day of
21 July [TWENTY-EIGHTH DAY OF FEBRUARY] of the year for which
22 the registration is required under the provisions of this act.

23 Sec. 4. Sec. 3(13), Ch. 124, SLA 1951 is amended to read:

24 (13) RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION. Application for renewal
25 of a vehicle registration shall be made by the owner upon
26 proper application and by payment of the annual license tax
27 for such vehicle as provided by this act. The commissioner
28 may receive applications for registration or renewal regis-
29 tration and grant the same and issue new registration cards

1 and plates at any time prior to the expiration of registra-
2 tion, but no person shall display upon a vehicle the new
3 registration plates prior to the March first preceding the
4 beginning of the registration year [DECEMBER FIFTEENTH OF
5 THE YEAR PRECEDING WHICH SUCH PLATES ARE ISSUED].

6 Sec. 5. Sec. 3, Ch. 124, SLA 1951, as amended by Ch. 50,
7 SLA 1953, Ch. 73, SLA 1953, Ch. 120, SLA 1957, and Ch. 73, SLA
8 1959 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

9 (14) IN-TRANSIT PERMITS AND SPECIAL CHARGES. The
10 commissioner may issue temporary in-transit permits,
11 valid for 30 days from the date of issuance. An in-
12 transit permit may be issued only to enable a vehicle which
13 would otherwise be required to be registered to be moved
14 from one place to another on the public highway before sale
15 or use. The commissioner shall charge \$5.00 for each
16 in-transit permit. The commissioner may make the fol-
17 lowing special charges: for special plates, not more
18 than \$3.50; for special numbers on regular plates, not
19 more than \$3.00; for a title search, not more than \$1.00.

20 Sec. 6. Sec. 6(2), Ch. 124, SLA 1951 is amended to read:

21 (2) NEW OWNER TO SECURE TRANSFERS. The transferee
22 before operating or permitting the operation of such vehicle
23 on any highway shall present the certificate of registration
24 and certificate of title, properly endorsed, accompanied by
25 a fee of \$2.00, to the department within 20 days following
26 transfer of ownership, and shall apply for and obtain a new
27 certificate of title and new registration for such vehicle,
28 except as permitted in sub-section (5) of this section. An
29 additional \$5.00 fine will be assessed for failure to comply

with the provisions of this subsection within 20 days following transfer of ownership.

Sec. 7. Motor vehicle registrations made for the calendar year 1962 shall expire on midnight of May 31, 1963.
