Relating to the furnishing of

reports on the activities of

the division of personnel.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE IN SECOND LEGISLATURE, FIRST

9

SESSION ASSEMBLED, THE HOUSE CONCURRING:

WHEREAS, the Division of Personnel and the Personnel Board

11

is an operating branch of the government of the State of Alaska,

12

spending public monies and making decisions which affect the

13

operating efficiency of all branches of the state government; and

14

WHEREAS, the legislature must have sufficient information

15

on a continuing basis to determine whether the program and

16

policies as set out in the law are being correctly and efficiently

17

carried out; and

18

WHEREAS, the legislature must also be able to determine what

19

changes in laws and policy, if any, are necessary in order to

20

permit the business of the state to be carried on expeditiously

21

and efficiently through its employees;

22

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in Second Legislature, First

23

Session assembled, the House of Representatives concurring, that

24

the legislature respectfully requests that the governor instruct

25

the director of personnel and the personnel board to submit an

26

annual report similar to those submitted by other divisions of

27

the state government.

28

The report should include, in addition to such other

29

information as the governor may direct:

1 A chart showing the number of state employees in each pay
2 grade at the beginning and end of the fiscal year, by agencies.

3 A statement of the maximum and minimum number of persons
4 employed during the fiscal year.

5 A summary by agency of the number of positions abolished
6 and the number of positions created.

7 A summary by agency of turnover information, i. e. the
8 number of new hires, termination and transfers.

9 The number of examinations given.

10 The number of requests for review, appeals and grievances
11 handled.

12 A resume of changes made in personnel rules and job
13 classifications.

14 Recommendations for such changes in laws and general pay
15 levels as the personnel board may deem appropriate.

16 Copies of the report should be made available to unions of
17 state employees in order to implement the purposes of Chapter 108,
18 Session Laws of Alaska, 1959.
