SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 24

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA  
SECOND LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

Relating to continued employment  
of civilian personnel on Clear  
Project in Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE IN SECOND LEGISLATURE, FIRST SESSION  
ASSEMBLED:

WHEREAS, there are approximately 750 civilian employees on  
the Ballistics Missile Early Warning System Project at Clear,  
Alaska, most of whom are trained and competent men after two  
years of service; and

WHEREAS, it has been reported that in 1962 there are plans  
to have this operation taken over by a branch of the military  
service; and

WHEREAS, during this period of recession in Alaska the im-  
pact of loss of work by 750 civilians would be of great economic  
harm to the railbelt area in Alaska;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in Second Legislature, First  
Session assembled, that the Federal Government, unless security  
measures are involved, continue to use civilian employees on the  
Ballistics Missile Early Warning System Project at Clear, Alaska;  
and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to  
the Honorable John F. Kennedy, President of the United States; the  
Honorable Robert McNamara, Secretary of Defense; the Honorable  
E. L. Bartlett and the Honorable Ernest Gruening, Senators from  
Alaska; and the Honorable Ralph J. Rivers, Representative from
