8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 23.10 is amended by adding new sections to
10 read:

11 ARTICLE 10. STRIKES AND LOCKOUTS

12 Sec. 23.10.425. RECRUITMENT OF STRIKEBREAKERS. No
13 person, firm, or corporation not directly involved in a
14 labor strike or lockout may recruit and bring into the state
15 any person for employment, or secure, or offer to secure em-
16 ployment for any person, when the purpose of recruiting,
17 securing, or offering to secure employment is to take the
18 place in the employment of employees in a business owned by
19 a person, firm, or corporation involved in a labor strike
20 or lockout.

21 Sec. 23.10.430. IMPORTATION OF PICKETS BY UNION. No
22 labor union may bring into this state persons to act as
23 pickets of a business owned by a person, firm, or corporation
24 where a labor strike or lockout exists.

25 Sec. 23.10.435. EXCEPTIONS. Secs. 425 - 430 and 440
26 of this chapter do not apply to activities and services
27 offered by or through the Department of Labor.

28 Sec. 23.10.440. PENALTIES. A person who violates secs.
29 425 - 430 of this chapter is punishable by imprisonment for

not more than one year, or by a fine of \$1,000, or by both.
