6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the definition of a
7 disabled veteran; and providing for an
8 effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 39.25.150(23) is amended to read:

11 (23) the granting of employment preference rights
12 to a veteran when he possesses the necessary qualifications
13 in the job classification for which he applies under this
14 chapter; the term "veteran" means a person with 90 days or
15 more active service in the armed forces of the United States
16 who has been honorably discharged after having served during
17 any period between April 6, 1917, and December 1, 1919,
18 between September 16, 1940, and December 31, 1947, or between
19 June 27, 1950, and January 31, 1955; the term "disabled
20 veteran" means a veteran who is rated by the United States
21 Veteran's Administration as having at least a ratable
22 [10 PER CENT] service-connected disability; in the examina-
23 tion to determine the qualification of applicants for
24 entrance into the classified service under merit system
25 examination, five additional points shall be added to the
26 passing grade of a veteran and ten additional points shall
27 be added to the passing grade of a disabled veteran; if a
28 position in the classified service is eliminated, employees
29 shall be released in accordance with rules which give due

effect to all factors; if all job qualifications are equal
the veteran shall be given preference over the nonveteran
and the veteran shall be kept on the job.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage
and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
