6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to prohibitions with  
7 respect to certain females in connection  
8 with liquor sales; and providing for an  
9 effective date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 \* Section 1. AS 04.15.090 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

12 Sec.. 04.15.090. PROHIBITIONS WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN  
13 FEMALES IN CONNECTION WITH LIQUOR SALES. (a) No female  
14 person employed by the holder of a license for a liquor or  
15 beverage dispensary, club, road house, restaurant, or common  
16 carrier dispensary, or by the operator or manager thereof,  
17 may solicit or encourage the purchase of any beverages by  
18 patrons of the licensed premises for consumption by such  
19 female person; nor may any such female person accept any  
20 beverage purchased by a patron of such an establishment.

21 (b) No holder of a license for a liquor or beverage  
22 dispensary, club, road house, restaurant, or common carrier  
23 dispensary, or an operator or manager thereof, may employ  
24 any female person to solicit or encourage the purchase of any  
25 beverages by patrons of the licensed premises for consumption  
26 by such female person; nor may any such holder, operator, or  
27 manager permit any female employee to accept any beverage  
28 purchased by a patron of such an establishment.

29 (c) A female person or the holder of a license for a

1 liquor dispensary, club, restaurant, or common carrier dis-  
2 pensary or the operator or manager thereof who violates this  
3 section is guilty of a misdemeanor.

4 \* Sec. 2. AS 04.15.100(a) is amended to read:

5 (a) A person who violates any provision of this title  
6 other than sec. [SECTIONS] 80 [AND 90] of this chapter is  
7 guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction is punishable by  
8 imprisonment of not more than one year, or by a fine of not  
9 more than \$500. Each violation is a separate offense.

10 \* Sec. 3. AS 04.10.040(b) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

11 (b) A citizen of the United States, over the age of  
12 21 years and of good moral character may be regularly em-  
13 ployed as a waiter or waitress in any establishment operat-  
14 ing under a liquor dispensary license. The duties of  
15 waitresses shall be confined to taking orders and serving  
16 drinks or food. The establishment must receive a permit from  
17 the board to employ females.

18 \* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage  
19 and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
