9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 Sec. 11.60.140. DEALING OR CONDUCTING GAMBLING GAME. A  
12 person who deals, plays, carries on, opens or causes to be  
13 opened, or who conducts, either as owner, proprietor or em-  
14 ployee, whether for hire or not, a game of faro, monte,  
15 roulette, rouge-et-noir, lansquenet, rondo, vigntun, twenty-  
16 one, poker, draw poker, brag, bluff, thaw, craps, or a bank-  
17 ing or other game played with cards, dice, a coin-operated  
18 machine, or other device, whether played for money, or for  
19 checks, chips, credit representing money, or other represen-  
20 tative of value, is, upon conviction, punishable by imprison-  
21 ment for not more than two years, or by a fine of not more  
22 than \$1,000, or by both [GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR, AND UPON  
23 CONVICTION IS PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$500,  
24 AND BY IMPRISONMENT IN A JAIL UNTIL THE FINE AND COSTS ARE  
25 PAID. A PERSON SO CONVICTED IS PUNISHABLE ONE DAY FOR EVERY  
26 \$2 OF THE FINE AND COSTS. THE IMPRISONMENT SHALL NOT EXCEED  
27 ONE YEAR].

LIQUOR TRAFFIC CONDUCTED AS NUISANCES. (a) A place where gaming or gambling is carried on, or where a banking or other game is played with cards, dice, a coin-operated machine, or other device, whether played for money, or for checks, chips, credit, representing money, or other representative of value, or where unlicensed manufacture or sale or drinking of intoxicating liquor is allowed, or where persons are permitted to resort for the purpose of gaming or gambling, and all implements or property used and kept in maintaining these places are declared to be common nuisances.

(b) A person who maintains, aids or abets, or is associated in maintaining such a place is, upon conviction, punishable by imprisonment for not more than two years, or by a fine of not more than \$1,000, or by both [GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR, AND UPON CONVICTION IS PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN \$100 NOR MORE THAN \$500, OR BY IMPRISONMENT IN A JAIL FOR NOT LESS THAN 30 DAYS NOR MORE THAN SIX MONTHS, OR BY BOTH].
